- 1 AN ACT Relating to nurse delegation; adding new sections to chapter
- 2 74.13 RCW; and creating a new section.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** The legislature finds that trained
- 5 unlicensed persons should be allowed to assist in the care of certain
- 6 foster children with medical needs.
- 7 NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. As used in section 3 of this act:
- 8 (1) "Stable condition" means a situation where the child's clinical
- 9 and behavioral status and nursing care needs are determined to be
- 10 nonfluctuating, consistent, and do not need frequent reassessment.
- 11 (2) "Unlicensed person" means an individual who is not licensed to
- 12 practice nursing, medicine, or another health occupation requiring a
- 13 license in Washington state, but who provides the services specified in
- 14 section 3(1) of this act to children in foster family homes as defined
- 15 in chapter 74.15 RCW. For the purpose of this section and section 3
- 16 of this act, members of the child's immediate family and foster parents
- 17 licensed under chapter 74.15 RCW are not considered unlicensed persons
- 18 and may perform nursing tasks without specific delegation.

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- 1 NEW SECTION. Sec. 3. (1) Unlicensed persons as defined in section
- 2 2 of this act are allowed to administer the following tasks at the
- 3 discretion of the delegating registered nurse based upon the registered
- 4 nurse's assessment of the person's skills.
- 5 (a) Oral medication;
- 6 (b) Topical medication, including ear, nose, and eye drops;
- 7 (c) Changing sterile dressings;
- 8 (d) Suppositories and unit dose enemas;
- 9 (e) Home blood glucose testing and monitoring;
- 10 (f) Injectable insulin;
- 11 (g) Gastrostomy tube feedings;
- 12 (h) Clean intermittent catheterization;
- 13 (i) Inhalants;
- 14 (j) Oro-pharyngeal suctioning;
- 15 (k) Intravenous therapy; and
- 16 (1) Prescribed emergency procedures to treat identified 17 anaphylactic reactions.
- 18 (2) The department of social and health services in conjunction 19 with the department of health shall adopt rules to implement this 20 section. Such rules shall include the following requirements:
- (a) Treatment authorized by this section must be prescribed by a health care practitioner licensed under Title 18 RCW who has prescriptive authority, acting within the scope of his or her license.
- 24 If the delegating registered nurse obtains verbal orders from the
- 25 health care practitioner amending the existing treatment plan, the 26 verbal orders shall be provided in writing to the unlicensed person.
- 27 (b) Delegation may be made only by a registered nurse.
- (c) Delegation may be made only in the case of children in stable condition not requiring ongoing nursing assessment.
- 30 (d) A registered nurse shall perform an assessment of the child's 31 condition including a plan of risk management, and provide written 32 delegation to the unlicensed person.
- 33 (e) Appropriate training for each case shall be provided using 34 standards established jointly by the department of health and the 35 department of social and health services.
- 36 (f) There shall be written instructions and appropriate supervision 37 of the trained unlicensed person. Supervision may be indirect.

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- 1 (g) Unlicensed persons shall be allowed to perform delegated tasks 2 only for a child for whom they have been trained; such training shall 3 not be transferable, but shall be specific to each child.
- 4 (h) The trained unlicensed person shall follow directions, or take 5 appropriate corrective action upon notice of inappropriate care to 6 comply with the care plan and directions of the delegating nurse in 7 charge.
- 8 (i) Each delegating nurse shall keep a record of each person to 9 whom tasks have been delegated, the training provided, and the results 10 of each follow-up visit; such record shall be distinct from any 11 clinical record.
- (j) An appropriate quality assurance system shall be established, including regular evaluation of the program, individual children, and outcomes, and a method to make regular adjustments in the program or level of care of children, and training of unlicensed persons.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 4. Sections 2 and 3 of this act are each added to chapter 74.13 RCW.

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
