
ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL 2171

- 1 AN ACT Relating to electrical contractors; amending RCW 19.28.120
- 2 and 19.28.350; adding a new section to chapter 19.28 RCW; and
- 3 prescribing penalties.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 **Sec. 1.** RCW 19.28.120 and 1992 c 217 s 2 are each amended to read 6 as follows:
- 7 (1) It is unlawful for any person, firm, partnership, corporation,
- 8 or other entity to engage in or submit a bid to engage in, conduct, or
- 9 carry on the business of installing or maintaining wires or equipment
- 10 to convey electric current, or installing or maintaining equipment to
- 11 be operated by electric current as it pertains to the electrical
- 12 industry, without having an unrevoked, unsuspended, and unexpired
- 13 electrical contractor license, issued by the department in accordance
- 14 with this chapter. However, bids subject to this section may be
- 15 submitted by a person, firm, partnership, corporation, or other entity
- 16 who is registered under chapter 18.27 RCW as long as the work subject
- 17 to this chapter is performed as required by this chapter. All
- 18 electrical contractor licenses expire twenty-four calendar months
- 19 following the day of their issue. The department may issue an

- 1 electrical contractors license for a period of less than twenty-four
- 2 months only for the purpose of equalizing the number of electrical
- 3 contractor licenses which expire each month. Application for an
- 4 electrical contractor license shall be made in writing to the
- 5 department, accompanied by the required fee. The application shall
- 6 state:
- 7 (a) The name and address of the applicant; in case of firms or
- 8 partnerships, the names of the individuals composing the firm or
- 9 partnership; in case of corporations, the names of the managing
- 10 officials thereof;
- 11 (b) The location of the place of business of the applicant and the
- 12 name under which the business is conducted;
- 13 (c) Employer social security number;
- 14 (d) As applicable: (i) The industrial insurance account number
- 15 covering employees domiciled in Washington; and (ii) evidence of
- 16 workers' compensation coverage in the applicant's state of domicile for
- 17 the applicant's employees working in Washington who are not domiciled
- 18 in Washington;
- 19 (e) Employment security department number;
- 20 (f) State excise tax registration number;
- 21 (g) Unified business identifier (UBI) account number may be
- 22 substituted for the information required by (d), (e), and (f) of this
- 23 subsection; and
- 24 (h) Whether a general or specialty electrical contractor license is
- 25 sought and, if the latter, the type of specialty. Electrical
- 26 contractor specialties include, but are not limited to: Residential,
- 27 domestic appliances, pump and irrigation, limited energy system, signs,
- 28 nonresidential maintenance, and a combination specialty. A general
- 29 electrical contractor license shall grant to the holder the right to
- 30 engage in, conduct, or carry on the business of installing or
- 31 maintaining wires or equipment to carry electric current, and
- 32 installing or maintaining equipment, or installing or maintaining
- 33 material to fasten or insulate such wires or equipment to be operated
- 34 by electric current, in the state of Washington. A specialty
- 35 electrical contractor license shall grant to the holder a limited right
- 36 to engage in, conduct, or carry on the business of installing or
- 37 maintaining wires or equipment to carry electrical current, and
- 38 installing or maintaining equipment; or installing or maintaining
- 39 material to fasten or insulate such wires or equipment to be operated

- (2) The department may verify the workers' compensation coverage information provided by the applicant under subsection (1)(d) of this section, including but not limited to information regarding the coverage of an individual employee of the applicant. If coverage is provided under the laws of another state, the department may notify the other state that the applicant is employing employees in Washington.
- 8 9 (3) The application for a contractor license shall be accompanied 10 by a bond in the sum of four thousand dollars with the state of Washington named as obligee in the bond, with good and sufficient 11 surety, to be approved by the department. The bond shall at all times 12 be kept in full force and effect, and any cancellation or revocation 13 thereof, or withdrawal of the surety therefrom, suspends the license 14 15 issued to the principal until a new bond has been filed and approved as 16 provided in this section. Upon approval of a bond, the department 17 shall on the next business day deposit the fee accompanying the application in the electrical license fund and shall file the bond in 18 19 the office. The department shall upon request furnish to any person, firm, partnership, corporation, or other entity a certified copy of the 20 bond upon the payment of a fee that the department shall set by rule. 21 The fee shall cover but not exceed the cost of furnishing the certified 22 The bond shall be conditioned that in any installation or 23 24 maintenance of wires or equipment to convey electrical current, and 25 equipment to be operated by electrical current, the principal will comply with the provisions of this chapter and with any electrical 26 ordinance, building code, or regulation of a city or town adopted 27 pursuant to RCW $19.28.010((\frac{2}{2}))$ (3) that is in effect at the time of 28 29 entering into a contract. The bond shall be conditioned further that 30 the principal will pay for all labor, including employee benefits, and material furnished or used upon the work, taxes and contributions to 31 the state of Washington, and all damages that may be sustained by any 32 person, firm, partnership, corporation, or other entity due to a 33 failure of the principal to make the installation or maintenance in 34 35 accordance with this chapter or any applicable ordinance, building code, or regulation of a city or town adopted pursuant to RCW 36 37 $19.28.010((\frac{(2)}{(2)}))$ <u>(3)</u>. In lieu of the surety bond required by this section the license applicant may file with the department a cash 38 39 deposit or other negotiable security acceptable to the department. If

- the license applicant has filed a cash deposit, the department shall deposit the funds in a special trust savings account in a commercial bank, mutual savings bank, or savings and loan association and shall pay annually to the depositor the interest derived from the account.
- 5 (4) The department shall issue general or specialty electrical contractor licenses to applicants meeting all of the requirements of 6 7 this chapter. The provisions of this chapter relating to the licensing 8 of any person, firm, partnership, corporation, or other entity 9 including the requirement of a bond with the state of Washington named 10 as obligee therein and the collection of a fee therefor, are exclusive, and no political subdivision of the state of Washington may require or 11 12 issue any licenses or bonds or charge any fee for the same or a similar 13 purpose. No person, firm, partnership, corporation, or other entity holding more than one specialty contractor license under this chapter 14 15 may be required to pay an annual fee for more than one such license or 16 to post more than one four thousand dollar bond, equivalent cash 17 deposit, or other negotiable security.
- (5) To obtain a general or specialty electrical contractor license 18 19 the applicant must designate an individual who currently possesses an 20 administrator's certificate as a general electrical contractor administrator or as a specialty electrical contractor administrator in 21 the specialty for which application has been made. 22 Administrator 23 certificate specialties include but are not limited to: Residential, 24 domestic, appliance, pump and irrigation, limited energy system, signs, 25 nonresidential maintenance, and combination specialty. To obtain an 26 administrator's certificate an individual must pass an examination as set forth in RCW 19.28.123 unless the applicant was a licensed 27 electrical contractor at any time during 1974. Applicants who were 28 29 electrical contractors licensed by the state of Washington at any time 30 during 1974 are entitled to receive a general electrical contractor administrator's certificate without examination if the applicants apply 31 prior to January 1, 1984. The board of electrical examiners shall 32 33 certify to the department the names of all persons who are entitled to 34 either a general or specialty electrical contractor administrator's 35 certificate.
- (6) It is unlawful for an electrical contractor to transfer an electrical contractor license issued by the department in accordance with this chapter to an unlicensed electrical contractor, or to allow

- 2 <u>another electrical contractor</u>.
- 3 **Sec. 2.** RCW 19.28.350 and 1988 c 81 s 12 are each amended to read 4 as follows:
- 5 Any person, firm, partnership, corporation, or other entity violating any of the provisions of RCW 19.28.010 through 19.28.360 6 7 shall be assessed a penalty of not less than ((fifty)) two hundred dollars or more than ten thousand dollars. The department shall set by 8 9 rule a schedule of penalties for violating RCW 19.28.010 through 19.28.360. The department shall notify the person, firm, partnership, 10 corporation, or other entity violating any of the provisions of RCW 11 12 19.28.010 through 19.28.360 of the amount of the penalty and of the specific violation by certified mail, return receipt requested, sent to 13 14 the last known address of the assessed party. Any penalty is subject 15 to review by an appeal to the board. The filing of an appeal stays the 16 effect of the penalty until the board makes its decision. The appeal shall be filed within fifteen days after notice of the penalty is given 17 18 to the assessed party by certified mail, return receipt requested, sent 19 to the last known address of the assessed party and shall be made by filing a written notice of appeal with the department. 20 shall be accompanied by a certified check for two hundred dollars, 21 22 which shall be returned to the assessed party if the decision of the 23 department is not sustained by the board. If the board sustains the 24 decision of the department, the two hundred dollars shall be applied by 25 the department to the payment of the per diem and expenses of the members of the board incurred in the matter, and any balance remaining 26 after payment of per diem and expenses shall be paid into the 27 electrical license fund. The hearing and review procedures shall be 28 29 conducted in accordance with chapter 34.05 RCW. The board shall assign 30 its hearings to an administrative law judge to conduct the hearing and issue a proposed decision and order. The board shall be allowed a 31 32 minimum of twenty days to review a proposed decision and shall issue its decision no later than the next regularly scheduled board meeting. 33
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 3. A new section is added to chapter 19.28 RCW to read as follows:
- 36 (1) All advertising and all contracts, correspondence, cards, 37 signs, posters, papers, and documents which show an electrical

contractor's name or address shall show the contractor's name or 1 2 address as licensed under this chapter.

3 (2)(a) The alphabetized listing of contractors appearing in the advertising section of telephone books or other directories and all advertising that shows the contractor's name or address shall show the contractor's current license number: PROVIDED, That on-premises signs shall not constitute advertising as provided in this section. materials used to directly solicit business from retail customers who are not businesses shall show the contractor's current license number. A contractor shall not use a false or expired license number in purchasing or offering to purchase an advertisement for which a license number is required. Advertising by airwave transmission shall not be 12 subject to this subsection if the person selling the advertisement obtains the contractor's current license number from the contractor.

- (b) A person selling advertising should not accept advertisements for which the contractor license number is required under (a) of this subsection if the contractor fails to provide the contractor license number.
- 19 (3) An electrical contractor shall not falsify a license number and use it in connection with any solicitation or identification as a 20 contractor. All individual contractors and all partners, associates, 21 salespersons, solicitors, officers, 22 and employees 23 contractors shall use their true names and addresses at all times while 24 engaged in the business or capacity of a contractor or activities 25 related thereto.
- 26 (4) A violation of this section is subject to the provisions of RCW 27 19.28.350. Penalties shall not apply to a violation determined to be an inadvertent error. When determining a violation of this section, 28 29 the director, administrative law judge, or the board shall hold 30 responsible the person who purchased the advertisement.
