- 1 AN ACT Relating to prevention of child abuse and neglect; amending
- 2 RCW 43.121.015 and 43.121.070; adding new sections to chapter 43.121
- 3 RCW; creating new sections; and making an appropriation.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** HEALTHY FAMILIES--WASHINGTON HOME VISITOR 6 PROGRAM--FINDINGS. The legislature finds that:
- 7 (1) Child abuse and neglect has been shown to be a significant risk
- 8 factor for violent behavior. Abused or neglected children have an
- 9 increased likelihood of arrest and involvement in violent crime as
- 10 youths or adults, and of victimization;
- 11 (2) One of the most effective strategies for preventing child abuse
- 12 and neglect is to provide parents with education and support beginning
- 13 with the birth of their first baby in parents' homes or in other
- 14 locations comfortable for parents; and
- 15 (3) Primary prevention efforts that provide parents with education
- 16 and support, and thereby reduce the rate of child abuse and neglect,
- 17 are an essential component of any youth violence prevention effort.

- 1 Sec. 2. RCW 43.121.015 and 1988 c 278 s 4 are each amended to read
- 2 as follows:
- As used in this chapter, the following terms have the meanings 4 indicated unless the context clearly requires otherwise.
- 5 (1) "Child" means an unmarried person who is under eighteen years 6 of age.
- 7 (2) "Community" means an individual political subdivision of the 8 state, a group of such political subdivisions, or a geographic area 9 within a political subdivision.
- 10 <u>(3)</u> "Council" means the Washington council for the prevention of 11 child abuse and neglect.
- 12 (((3))) <u>(4) "Parent" means the birth or adoptive parent, or legal</u>
 13 guardian of a child.
- 14 <u>(5)</u> "Primary prevention" of child abuse and neglect means any 15 effort designed to inhibit or preclude the initial occurrence of child 16 abuse and neglect, both by the promotion of positive parenting and 17 family interaction, and the remediation of factors linked to causes of 18 child maltreatment.
- $((\frac{4}{}))$ (6) "Secondary prevention" means services and programs that identify and assist families under such stress that abuse or neglect is likely or families display symptoms associated with child abuse or neglect.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 3. HEALTHY FAMILIES--WASHINGTON HOME VISITOR PROGRAM. (1) There is established in the council a program to coordinate and fund up to ten community-based healthy families-- Washington home visitor program sites. Selection of program sites shall be made competitively based upon compliance with RCW 43.121.070, 43.121.080 and sections 4 and 5 of this act.
- 29 (2) Program criteria shall be established by the council in 30 consultation with the family policy council established pursuant to 31 chapter 70.190 RCW, and with private and public groups involved in 32 child abuse and neglect prevention and shall reflect the following 33 principles:
- 34 (a) Family policy principles enunciated by the family policy 35 council;
- (b) Flexibility in program design and implementation to accommodateunique community characteristics and needs;

- 1 (d) Availability of services to all parents of newborns who need 2 support, delivered at the level of intensity and duration that best 3 meets the needs of each family; and
- 4 (e) Increased coordination of existing services to prospective 5 parents and parents of newborn children.
- 6 (3) Where appropriate, the council may utilize funds in the 7 children's trust fund for program sites established pursuant to 8 sections 3 through 5 of this act.
- 9 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 4.** HEALTHY FAMILIES--WASHINGTON HOME VISITOR 10 PROGRAM SITES--REQUIREMENTS. (1) Each community-based healthy 11 families--Washington home visitor program site shall be designed to 12 reduce the incidence of child abuse and neglect in the defined 13 community.
- 14 (2) Program participation by parents shall be voluntary. In offering or providing services, every effort shall be made to 15 16 coordinate with and utilize other programs that fund or provide any of the services referenced in subsection (3) of this section. The primary 17 18 focus for expenditure of healthy families -- Washington home visitor 19 program funds should be development of a coordinated system of family support services for parents of newborn children in the community, 20 provision of home visits and provision of services referenced in 21 22 subsection (3) of this section that are not currently funded from other 23 sources.
- 24 (3) Each program site shall make the following services available 25 to families in the defined community:
- 26 (a) Visits for all expectant or new parents, either at the parent's 27 home or another location with which the parent is comfortable;
- (b) Screening prior to or soon after the birth of a child to assess the family's strengths and goals, and define areas of concern in consultation with the family;
- 31 (c) Parenting education and skills development;
- 32 (d) Parenting and family support information and referral;
- 33 (e) Parent support groups;
- 34 (f) Service coordination for individual families, and assistance 35 with accessing services, provided in a manner that ensures that 36 individual families have only one individual or agency to which they 37 look for service coordination. Where appropriate for a family, service

- coordination may be conducted through interdisciplinary or interagency 1 2 teams.
- 3 (4) The council shall evaluate each program site. Each program 4 site shall cooperate in the council's evaluation, and be evaluated 5 based solely on the rate by which child abuse and neglect reports in the defined community are reduced, measured from the rates prior to the 6 7 implementation of the program. Program sites that demonstrate by 8 empirical evidence that they have been successful in reducing the child 9 abuse and neglect rate in the defined community shall be eligible for
- 10 consideration if reauthorized funding becomes available.
- NEW SECTION. HEALTHY FAMILIES--WASHINGTON HOME VISITOR 11 Sec. 5.
- 12 PROGRAM SITES--APPLICATIONS. Applications for healthy families--
- 13 Washington home visitor program funding shall:
- 14 (1) Define the community requesting funding;
- 15 (2) Designate a lead agency or organization for the program site;
- 16 (3) Contain evidence of the active participation of entities in the community that will participate in the program; 17
- 18 (4) Demonstrate the participation of parents who are not affiliated 19 with participating entities in the development of the program;
- (5) Describe the specific activities that will be undertaken by the 20 21 program site;
- 22 (6) Identify the community matching funds required under RCW 23 43.121.080;
- 24 (7) Include statistics on child abuse and neglect rates in the 25 community over at least the past five years. Upon request, the department of social and health services shall 26 assist in the compilation of these statistics for applicants; and 27
- (8) Include components that will demonstrate sensitivity to 28 29 religious, cultural, and socioeconomic differences in the defined community. 30
- 31 **Sec. 6.** RCW 43.121.070 and 1982 c 4 s 7 are each amended to read 32 as follows:
- 33 In awarding contracts under RCW 43.121.060 and sections 3 through
- 5 of this act, consideration shall be given to factors such as need, 34
- 35 diversity of geographic locations, coordination with or enhancement of
- existing services, and the extensive use of volunteers in the program. 36
- Further consideration shall be given to the extent to which contract 37

- 1 proposals are based on prior research that indicates a probability of
- 2 goal achievement.
- 3 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 7.** APPROPRIATION. The sum of one million
- 4 dollars, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated for
- 5 the biennium ending June 30, 1995, from the general fund to the
- 6 Washington council for the prevention of child abuse and neglect for
- 7 the healthy families--Washington home visitor program. No single
- 8 program site shall receive funding in excess of one hundred thousand
- 9 dollars for the biennium ending June 30, 1995.
- 10 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 8.** CAPTIONS. Captions as used in this act
- 11 constitute no part of the law.
- 12 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 9.** Sections 3 through 5 of this act are each
- 13 added to chapter 43.121 RCW.
