- 1 AN ACT Relating to the disposal of large residential appliances;
- 2 adding new sections to chapter 70.95 RCW; and prescribing penalties.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** Unless the context clearly requires
- 5 otherwise, the definitions in this section apply throughout sections 2
- 6 through 4 of this act.
- 7 (1) "Large appliances" means common household appliances containing
- 8 a significant quantity of recyclable metal and includes but is not
- 9 limited to refrigerators, freezers, stoves, ranges, ovens, air
- 10 conditioners, washing machines, clothes dryers, dishwashing machines,
- 11 water heaters, trash compactors, garbage disposals, dehumidifiers, and
- 12 heat pumps.
- 13 (2) "Retired large appliances" means used large appliances that are
- 14 relinquished by their owners.
- 15 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** (1) No person may knowingly dispose of a
- 16 large appliance in mixed municipal solid waste.

- 1 (2) No owner or operator of a solid waste disposal site may
- 2 knowingly accept for disposal large appliances in mixed municipal solid
- 3 waste, except when authorized to do so by the department.
- 4 (3) This section shall take effect January 1, 1995.
- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 3.** (1) By September 1, 1994, the department
- 6 shall develop guidelines specifying how wastes contained in retired
- 7 large appliances shall be removed and managed. At a minimum, the
- 8 guidelines shall include the removal and management of:
- 9 (a) Capacitors and ballasts containing polychlorinated biphenyls;
- 10 (b) Mercury switches;
- 11 (c) Compressor oil;
- 12 (d) Refrigerant gases; and
- 13 (e) Any other waste identified by the department.
- 14 (2) Beginning January 1, 1995, and thereafter, an owner or operator
- 15 of a facility that is used to recycle retired large appliances shall
- 16 ensure that all dangerous wastes contained in retired large appliances
- 17 are removed in conformance with the guidelines developed under
- 18 subsection (1) of this section.
- 19 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 4.** Upon request by the department, a large
- 20 appliance recycler shall verify conformance with section 3 of this act.
- 21 Failure to comply with this section shall result in a civil penalty of
- 22 fifty dollars for each appliance, not to exceed a total of ten thousand
- 23 dollars.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 5. Section 2 of this act is applicable only to
- 25 jurisdictions where the recycling infrastructure for large appliances
- 26 is active, as determined by the department of ecology.
- 27 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 6.** Sections 1 through 5 of this act are each
- 28 added to chapter 70.95 RCW.
