- 1 AN ACT Relating to radon testing in residential structures; and 2 amending RCW 19.27.192.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 19.27.192 and 1992 c 132 s 1 are each amended to read 5 as follows:
- 6 (1) Beginning July 1, 1992, at the time of final inspection of a

new single-family residence or ((each ground floor unit in)) a

- 8 multifamily residential building, the building inspector shall deliver
- 9 to ((each residence and each ground floor unit a three-month etched
- 10 track radon measurement device that is listed on a current federal
- 11 environmental protection agency radon measurement proficiency list.
- 12 Postage to the testing facility and the cost of testing and
- 13 notification to the homeowner shall be included with the device. The
- 14 device, the instructions included with the device, and the instructions
- 15 provided by the state building code council pursuant to subsection (2)
- 16 of this section shall be placed in a conspicuous location)) the
- 17 property owner a preaddressed postcard to be returned to the
- 18 jurisdiction at the discretion of the property owner. The property
- 19 owner may indicate, on the card, his or her desire to have a three-

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- 1 month etched-track radon measurement device supplied to him or her at
- 2 $\underline{\text{no charge}}$. The $((\frac{\text{device}}{}))$ $\underline{\text{card}}$ shall be provided to the building
- 3 inspector by the local government.
- 4 (2) Not later than June 15, 1992, in consultation with the 5 department of health and the Washington state association of building 6 code officials, the state building code council shall:
- 7 (a) Develop instructions for use by the <u>property</u> owner or occupant 8 on the proper means of installation, maintenance and removal of the 9 radon measurement device provided for in subsection (1) of this section 10 and distribute the instructions to all affected county and city 11 building departments; and
- 12 (b) Distribute to all affected county and city building departments 13 the current federal environmental protection agency radon measurement 14 proficiency list and known sources for the devices.
- 15 (3) The <u>property</u> owner of a new single-family residence or of a
 16 multifamily residential building shall be responsible for returning the
 17 radon measurement device <u>request card</u> left by a building inspector
 18 pursuant to this section ((to the appropriate testing laboratory in
 19 accordance with the instructions left with the device by the building
 20 inspector)).
- (4) The building inspector's approval of the final inspection on the final inspection record card shall be prima facie evidence that the building inspector left the radon measurement device <u>request card</u> and instructions as required by this section.
- (5) The building inspector responsible for the final inspection, the building inspector's employer, and the county or city within which a single-family residence or multifamily residential building is located shall not be liable for injuries caused by:
- 29 (a) The failure of the occupant or owner of the residence or 30 building to <u>request</u>, properly install, monitor, or send a radon 31 measurement device to the testing laboratory; or
- 32 (b) Radon entering into any single-family residence or multifamily 33 residential building.
- 34 (6) This section shall expire June 30, 1995.

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
