
ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL 2453

- 1 AN ACT Relating to a mental health service delivery systems pilot
- 2 project; and adding new sections to chapter 71.24 RCW.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** The legislature finds that continuous and 5 accelerating pressures for efficiency and effectiveness in health care
 - service delivery, coupled with the need to redefine how government
- 7 works, necessitates the development of new approaches to service
- 8 delivery that are resource sensitive, accessible, and maintain an
- 9 effective continuum of care. To that end, the mental health service
- 10 delivery system is not exempted from the pressures and needs to
- 11 demonstrate a flexible, effective, and efficient use of scarce
- 12 resources that meets the needs of a changing health care environment.
- 13 The legislature further finds that the current complex set of rules and
- 14 regulations, audited and administered at multiple levels of the mental
- 15 health system, focuses primarily on the process of providing mental
- 16 health services and does little to address consumer and system
- 17 outcomes.

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- 18 The legislature further finds that the compliance with process
- 19 standards and the duplicative administering and monitoring of the

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- 1 standards reduce the amount of mental health services that are
- 2 accessible to consumers. The legislature intends under sections 2
- 3 through 4 of this act to allow for development of new streamlined
- 4 approaches to community-based mental health service delivery infused
- 5 with incentives that reward efficiency, improve productivity, enhance
- 6 positive outcomes for the consumers and the service delivery system,
- 7 and effect a high-quality continuum of care.
- 8 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** The department of social and health services
- 9 shall establish a comprehensive and collaborative pilot project within
- 10 two distinct regional support networks and with local mental health
- 11 service providers aimed at creating innovative and streamlined
- 12 community mental health service delivery systems, in order to carry out
- 13 the purposes set forth in section 1 of this act and to capture the
- 14 diversity of the community mental health service delivery system.
- The pilot projects must accomplish the following:
- 16 (1) Identification, review, and cataloging of all rules,
- 17 regulations, duplicative administrative and monitoring functions, and
- 18 other requirements that currently lead to inefficiencies in the
- 19 community mental health service delivery system and, if possible,
- 20 eliminate the requirements;
- 21 (2) The systematic and incremental development of a single system
- 22 of accountability for all state-appropriated funds used to provide
- 23 mental health services. Assessment must be made regarding the
- 24 feasibility of also including federal and local funds into the single
- 25 system of accountability;
- 26 (3) The elimination of process regulations and related contract and
- 27 reporting requirements. In place of the regulations and requirements,
- 28 a set of specific mutually agreed upon, nationally recognized outcomes
- 29 for mental health clients must be developed and used to measure the
- 30 performance of mental health service providers;
- 31 (4) The involvement of mental health consumers and their
- 32 representatives in the pilot projects. Mental health consumers and
- 33 their representatives will be involved in the development of outcome
- 34 standards for mental health clients and other related aspects of the
- 35 pilot projects;
- 36 (5) Evaluation of the feasibility of contractual agreements between
- 37 the department of social and health services and regional support
- 38 networks and mental health service providers that link financial

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- 1 incentives to the success or failure of mental health service providers
- 2 and regional support networks to meet outcomes established for mental
- 3 health service clients; and
- 4 (6) An independent evaluation component to measure the success of
- 5 the projects.
- 6 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 3.** The pilot projects established in section 2
- 7 of this act must be fully implemented by July 1, 1995, with annual
- 8 progress reports submitted to the appropriate committees of the
- 9 legislature beginning November 1, 1994. In addition, the department of
- 10 social and health services, the participating regional support
- 11 networks, and the local mental health service providers shall report to
- 12 the appropriate policy and fiscal committees of the legislature on the
- 13 need for any changes in state statute, rule, policy, or procedure, and
- 14 any change in federal statute, regulation, policy, or procedure to
- 15 ensure the purposes specified in section 1 of this act are carried out.
- 16 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 4.** To carry out the purposes specified in
- 17 section 1 of this act, the department of social and health services is
- 18 encouraged to utilize its authority to immediately eliminate any
- 19 unnecessary rules, regulations, standards, or contracts, to immediately
- 20 eliminate duplication of audits or any other unnecessarily duplicated
- 21 functions, and to seek any waivers of federal or state rules or
- 22 regulations necessary to achieve the purpose of streamlining the mental
- 23 health system and infusing it with incentives that reward efficiency,
- 24 positive outcomes for clients, and quality services.
- 25 NEW SECTION. Sec. 5. Sections 1 through 4 of this act are each
- 26 added to chapter 71.24 RCW.

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
