State of Washington 53rd Legislature 1994 Regular Session

By Representatives Sommers, Sheldon and Long; by request of Office of Financial Management

Read first time 01/17/94. Referred to Committee on Appropriations.

- 1 AN ACT Relating to the annual basic education allocation of funds;
- 2 amending RCW 28A.150.260 and 28A.150.260; and creating a new section.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** The legislature finds that the current formula of four certificated administrative staff per thousand students
- 6 exceeds the level needed to provide a program of basic education in
- 7 Washington public schools. The legislature finds that a ratio of three
- 8 and nine-tenths certificated administrative staff per thousand students
- 9 meets the current needs of the state's school children and the
- 10 requirements of Article IX, section 1 of the state Constitution.
- 11 **Sec. 2.** RCW 28A.150.260 and 1992 c 141 s 303 are each amended to
- 12 read as follows:
- 13 The basic education allocation for each annual average full time
- 14 equivalent student shall be determined in accordance with the following
- 15 procedures:
- 16 (1) The governor shall and the superintendent of public instruction
- 17 may recommend to the legislature a formula based on a ratio of students
- 18 to staff for the distribution of a basic education allocation for each

- 6 (a) Certificated instructional staff and their related costs;
 - (b) Certificated administrative staff and their related costs;
 - (c) Classified staff and their related costs;
 - (d) Nonsalary costs;
- 10 (e) Extraordinary costs of remote and necessary schools and small 11 high schools, including costs of additional certificated and classified 12 staff; and
- 13 (f) The attendance of students pursuant to RCW 28A.335.160 and 14 28A.225.250 who do not reside within the servicing school district.
- 15 (2)(a) This formula for distribution of basic education funds shall 16 be reviewed biennially by the superintendent and governor. 17 recommended formula shall be subject to approval, amendment or rejection by the legislature. The formula shall be for allocation 18 19 purposes only. While the legislature intends that the allocations for additional instructional staff be used to increase the ratio of such 20 staff to students, nothing in this section shall require districts to 21 reduce the number of administrative staff below existing levels. 22
 - (b) The formula adopted by the legislature shall reflect the following ratios at a minimum: (i) Forty-nine certificated instructional staff to one thousand annual average full time equivalent students enrolled in grades kindergarten through three; (ii) forty-six certificated instructional staff to one thousand annual average full time equivalent students in grades four through twelve; (iii) ((four)) three and nine-tenths certificated administrative staff to one thousand annual average full time equivalent students in grades kindergarten through twelve; and (iv) sixteen and sixty-seven one-hundredths classified personnel to one thousand annual average full time equivalent students enrolled in grades kindergarten through twelve.

- (b) Certificated administrative staff shall include all those persons who are chief executive officers, chief administrative officers, confidential employees, supervisors, principals, or assistant principals within the meaning of RCW 41.59.020(4).
 - (4) Each annual average full time equivalent certificated classroom teacher's direct classroom contact hours shall average at least twenty-five hours per week. Direct classroom contact hours shall be exclusive of time required to be spent for preparation, conferences, or any other nonclassroom instruction duties. Up to two hundred minutes per week may be deducted from the twenty-five contact hour requirement, at the discretion of the school district board of directors, to accommodate authorized teacher/parent-guardian conferences, recess, passing time between classes, and informal instructional activity. (c) In the event the legislature rejects the distribution formula recommended by the governor, without adopting a new distribution formula, the distribution formula for the previous school year shall remain in effect: PROVIDED, That the distribution formula developed pursuant to this section shall be for state apportionment and equalization purposes only and shall not be construed as mandating specific operational functions of local school districts other than those program requirements identified in RCW 28A.150.220 The enrollment of any district shall be the annual 28A.150.100. average number of full time equivalent students and part time students as provided in RCW 28A.150.350, enrolled on the first school day of each month and shall exclude full time equivalent handicapped students recognized for the purposes of allocation of state funds for programs under RCW 28A.155.010 through 28A.155.100.
