HOUSE BILL 2602

State of Washington 53rd Legislature 1994 Regular Session

- 1 AN ACT Relating to ornithological research; creating new sections;
- 2 providing an effective date; and providing an expiration date.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 The legislature finds that many talented NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. 5 citizens of Washington state have an interest in ornithology, and that countless volunteer hours are spent by these citizens participating in 6 research and enhancement projects. The legislature further finds that ornithological research is not coordinated state-wide, nor is it funded 8 9 adequately at the state level. It is the intent of the legislature to 10 create an opportunity for a state-citizen partnership that will maximize the knowledge gained by coordinated research and will minimize 11 12 the cost of such research.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. The director of the department of fish and wildlife shall appoint a nine-member advisory committee to develop an ornithological research plan. Membership on the committee shall include but not be limited to persons representing recognized Washington state ornithologists; members of the academic community in ornithology or related fields; amateur birdwatchers; federal, state,

- 1 and local agencies; Indian tribes; and the environmental community. The
- 2 advisory committee shall elect a chairperson, and shall meet at least
- 3 quarterly. Members of the committee shall receive no additional
- 4 compensation for their services, however travel expenses shall be
- 5 allowed in accordance with RCW 43.03.050 and 43.03.060. Decisions of
- 6 the committee shall be subject to final approval by the director.
- 7 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 3.** The advisory committee shall prepare an
- 8 ornithological research plan that emphasizes the use of citizen
- 9 volunteers in conducting the research. The committee shall submit the
- 10 plan to the appropriate committees of the legislature by December 31,
- 11 1995. The plan shall consist of the following:
- 12 (1) A prioritization of ornithological research needs in the state;
- 13 (2) An implementation plan for completing the research;
- 14 (3) A proposed budget for implementation; and
- 15 (4) Ways of incorporating volunteer activity and citizen donations
- 16 into ornithological research.
- 17 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 4.** The committee may solicit gifts, grants,
- 18 conveyances, bequests, and devises, whether of real or personal
- 19 property, or both, in fee or less than fee, in trust or otherwise, to
- 20 be directed to the department for the purposes outlined in section 3 of
- 21 this act. The committee may solicit contracts for work, financial and
- 22 in-kind contributions, and support from private industries, interest
- 23 groups, federal and state sources, and other sources for the purposes
- 24 of this chapter.
- 25 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 5.** This act shall take effect July 1, 1994.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 6. This act shall expire January 1, 1996.
