- 1 AN ACT Relating to education technology in schools; adding new
- 2 sections to chapter 28A.650 RCW; repealing 1993 c 336 s 704
- 3 (uncodified); and making an appropriation.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** (1) The technology in schools grant program
- 6 is hereby created. The purpose of the grant program is to increase
- 7 student learning, consistent with the student learning goals in RCW
- 8 28A.150.210, through the expanded and more productive use of technology
- 9 in Washington's public school system.
- 10 (2) Funds from the grant program may be used by school districts
- 11 for technology hardware and software acquisition, installation of
- 12 networks, staff training, and other purposes consistent with the
- 13 purposes of the grant program.
- 14 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** (1) To be eligible for a grant, school
- 15 districts shall submit a grant application and school district
- 16 technology plan to the superintendent of public instruction by October
- 17 1, 1995. The technology plan shall:
- 18 (a) Be curriculum-based;

- 1 (b) Align all components of the plan toward student attainment of 2 the student learning goals in RCW 28A.150.210;
- 3 (c) Incorporate the technology needs identified by personnel and 4 parents in individual schools;
- 5 (d) Provide for staff training on how to use the technology 6 effectively;
- 7 (e) Provide on-line access to resources and communication for all 8 students and educators, including access to the office of the 9 superintendent of public instruction, the district's educational 10 service district, and the center for the improvement of student 11 learning;
- (f) Include a long-term commitment by the school district for the operation, maintenance, and upgrading of equipment, including identifying sources of funds; and
- 15 (g) Be consistent with applicable provisions of the state-wide 16 technology plan required in RCW 28A.650.015.
- 17 (2) The school district technology plans shall be reviewed by a 18 task force created by the superintendent of public instruction that 19 includes state-wide representation. The task force shall make 20 recommendations to the superintendent regarding whether the technology 21 plans have met the eligibility criteria in subsection (1) of this 22 section.
- 23 (3) In addition to the submission of a technology plan, school 24 districts also shall make a commitment to provide a financial match to 25 the state grant as calculated in accordance with section 3 of this act.
- 26 (4) The superintendent of public instruction shall make decisions 27 on the grant applications by December 15, 1995.
- 28 NEW SECTION. Sec. 3. (1) The amount of funds granted to school 29 districts with approved applications shall be determined by the 30 superintendent of public instruction based on a formula that includes the following: The number of full-time equivalent students enrolled in 31 the number of full-time equivalent students in all of 32 the district; 33 the approved districts; a ratio based on the relative per student property valuation of school districts in the state; and funds 34 available for the grant program. The minimum grant to a school 35 district shall be twelve thousand dollars. 36
- 37 (2) School districts shall match the state grant with other state 38 or local funds. The match may include private cash or in-kind

- 1 contributions. Expenditures on technology made before the approval of
- 2 the district's technology plan may not be used in calculating the local
- 3 match. The match rate shall be determined by the superintendent of
- 4 public instruction, and be calculated on a ratio based on the relative
- 5 per student property valuation of school districts in the state.
- 6 School districts with higher per student property valuations shall pay
- 7 a higher match. However, the local match for individual school
- 8 districts shall not be greater than eighty percent, and the average per
- 9 pupil weighted match shall be approximately fifty percent.
- 10 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 4.** The superintendent of public instruction may
- 11 use up to ten percent of the funds appropriated for the technology in
- 12 schools grant program for assisting school districts in developing
- 13 technology plans, developing a state-wide network, providing technical
- 14 assistance to school districts, and managing and evaluating the grant
- 15 program. The superintendent may delegate any of these responsibilities
- 16 to educational service districts.
- 17 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 5.** The superintendent of public instruction
- 18 shall adopt rules as necessary to implement sections 1 through 4 of
- 19 this act.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 6. 1993 c 336 s 704 (uncodified) is repealed.
- 21 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 7.** Sections 1 through 5 of this act are each
- 22 added to chapter 28A.650 RCW.
- 23 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 8.** The sum of fifty million dollars, or as much
- 24 thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated for the biennium ending
- 25 June 30, 1995, from the budget stabilization account to the education
- 26 technology grant account for the purposes of this act.
