- 1 AN ACT Relating to closed-captioning video movies for the deaf and
- 2 hard of hearing; adding a new chapter to Title 19 RCW; and providing an
- 3 effective date.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. The legislature finds that: Closed-caption for the deaf and hard of hearing decoding capability technology is
- 7 built into television sets manufactured after 1993; closed-captioned
- 8 television has made it possible for thousands of deaf and hard of
- 9 hearing people to gain access to and use the television medium, thus
- 10 significantly improving the quality of their lives; closed-captioning
- 11 television can assist both hearing and hearing impaired children with
- 12 reading and learning skills, and improve literacy skills among adults;
- 13 and closed-captioned television can assist those among our immigrant
- 14 population who are learning English as a second language with language
- 15 comprehension.
- 16 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** A video movie, documentary, course, product,
- 17 or merchandise that has been reproduced in a video storage medium
- 18 format for distribution, sale, rent, loan, or lease for educational,

- 1 instructional, commercial, informational, promotional, or entertainment
- 2 purposes must be closed-captioned for the deaf and hard of hearing.
- 3 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 3.** Sections 1 and 2 of this act shall
- 4 constitute a new chapter in Title 19 RCW.
- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 4.** This act shall take effect December 31,
