
HOUSE BILL 2792

State of Washington 53rd Legislature 1994 Regular Session

1 AN ACT Relating to the job opportunities and basic skills program;
2 adding a new section to chapter 74.25 RCW; creating new sections; and
3 declaring an emergency.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 1.** (1) The legislature finds that effective use
6 of state and federal job opportunities and basic skills program funds
7 is essential, because of the positive results such expenditures can
8 have for individuals and the state. Helping income assistance
9 recipients who have been receiving assistance for several years find
10 employment at wages that will meet family needs allows these
11 individuals to achieve financial self-sufficiency and reduces state
12 public assistance expenditures.

13 (2) The legislature intends to determine whether a more flexible
14 community-based approach to increasing basic skills and job
15 opportunities for income assistance recipients who have been receiving
16 assistance for several years can result in a greater number of these
17 recipients achieving financial self-sufficiency than under the current
18 system for administering job opportunities and basic skills program
19 funds.

1 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 74.25 RCW
2 to read as follows:

3 (1) In five counties, geographically distributed throughout
4 Washington state, the department shall, within available funds,
5 establish alternative job opportunities and basic skills programs.

6 (2) In establishing the alternative programs, the department shall:

7 (a) Contract with community-based nonprofit organizations to
8 provide intensive case management, basic skills training, job or
9 vocational training, job development, job search, and support services
10 to income assistance recipients who have been receiving assistance for
11 a period of at least thirty-six months of the preceding sixty months.
12 Contracted services may be provided directly by the contracting
13 community-based nonprofit organization, by subcontract with other
14 entities, or through direct purchases of goods or services;

15 (b) Provide that participation in the program by public assistance
16 recipients is voluntary;

17 (c) Ensure that recipients participating in the program receive
18 intensive case management services that address their individual and
19 family needs;

20 (d) Broadly define support services to include any services needed
21 by the recipient to achieve self-sufficiency; and

22 (e) Provide that if a participating recipient, after receiving
23 services under this alternative program for twenty-four months or
24 completing an established vocational education program, whichever is
25 later, has not terminated their receipt of income assistance, that
26 participating recipient's income assistance grant will be reduced by
27 ten percent for the year following the month in which the twelve-month
28 period expired or an established vocational education program was
29 completed, whichever is later, and by an additional fifteen percent for
30 any subsequent year.

31 (3) Evaluation of the programs established under this section shall
32 measure the following outcomes:

33 (a) The number of participating recipients in the program who found
34 employment; and

35 (b) Whether the jobs found had compensation sufficient to allow the
36 recipients to achieve long-term economic self-sufficiency.

1 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 3.** On or before July 1, 1994, the department
2 shall request any congressional or federal regulatory authorization
3 necessary to implement this act.

4 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 4.** This act is necessary for the immediate
5 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the
6 state government and its existing public institutions, and shall take
7 effect immediately.

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
