- AN ACT Relating to restrictions on mailings by state legislators;
- 2 and amending RCW 42.17.132.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 Sec. 1. RCW 42.17.132 and 1993 c 2 s 25 (Initiative Measure No.
- 5 134) are each amended to read as follows:
- 6 During the twelve-month period preceding the expiration of a state
- 7 legislator's term in office, no incumbent to that office may mail to a
- 8 constituent at public expense a letter, newsletter, brochure, or other
- 9 piece of literature that is not in direct response to that
- 10 constituent's request for a response or for information.
- 11 constituent's contact of a legislator shall be deemed to be a request
- 12 for a response from that legislator, including contact by verbal
- 13 communication, letter, sign language, telegram, hot-line message,
- 14 telephone, E-mail, other methods of electronic communication, and other
- 15 normal means of communication. However, one mailing mailed within
- 16 thirty days after the start of a regular legislative session and one
- 17 mailing mailed within sixty days after the end of a regular legislative
- 18 session of identical newsletters to constituents are permitted. A

- 1 violation of this section constitutes use of the facilities of a public
- 2 office for the purpose of assisting a campaign under RCW 42.17.130.
- The house of representatives and senate shall specifically limit
- 4 expenditures per member for the total cost of mailings, including but

5 not limited to production costs, printing costs, and postage.
