HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION 4407

1 WHEREAS, The State of Washington in the United States of America 2 and the Province of Taiwan have an extensive cultural, economic, and 3 political relationship; and

WHEREAS, The manifestation of these relationships can be found in the fact that more than five billion dollars in trade was done between the State of Washington and the Province of Taiwan in 1991 and more than forty-five thousand visitors came to the State of Washington from the Province of Taiwan; and

9 WHEREAS, The State of Washington has chosen to recognize the 10 special nature of the relationship of the partners by the establishment 11 of a Trade Office in Taipei; and

12 WHEREAS, The benefits of a continued expansion of trade between the 13 State of Washington and the Province of Taiwan include increases in 14 trade-related employment and greater markets for the products of both 15 states; and

16 WHEREAS, The State of Washington and the Province of Taiwan have 17 worked together to have officially sponsored exchanges in the fine 18 arts, recreation, and political fields; and

WHEREAS, Such exchanges provide opportunities for the people of theState of Washington and the people of the Province of Taiwan to benefit

by gaining a greater appreciation for the history, fine arts, political
institutions, and culture of each other;

3 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, By the House of Representatives of 4 the State of Washington, the Senate concurring, That the State of 5 Washington declares that it agrees to enter into a sister state 6 relationship with the Province of Taiwan; and

7 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Governor of the State of 8 Washington is encouraged to continue to use the influence of the Office 9 of Governor to promote increased trade, cultural exchanges, and tourism 10 between the two sister states.
