- 1 AN ACT Relating to creating an aerospace industry legislative task
- 2 force; creating a new section; and declaring an emergency.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. (1) The subcommittee on the aerospace
- 5 industry is established as a subcommittee of the executive-legislative
- 6 committee on economic development created in chapter . . . (Senate Bill
- 7 No. 5300), Laws of 1993. The subcommittee is to examine the overall
- 8 impacts of the aerospace industry work slowdown and make
- 9 recommendations to the full committee, the governor, and the
- 10 legislature regarding:
- 11 (a) The need for short-term and long-term assistance for workers
- 12 made unemployed by the slowdown, including extending unemployment
- 13 benefits, job retraining, new employment assistance, family assistance,
- 14 and other types of assistance; and
- 15 (b) A long-term approach to diversification of the region most
- 16 affected by aerospace business fluctuations.
- 17 In conducting the examination, the subcommittee shall consider the
- 18 impacts on: The state and substate regional economies; displaced

- 1 workers and their families; and businesses not directly related to the 2 aerospace industry.
- 3 (2) The subcommittee shall consist of at least three members of the 4 full committee and may include advisory members. The advisory members 5 may include representatives from: (a) The aerospace industry; (b) 6 chambers of commerce and economic development councils; (c) unions 7 representing aerospace workers; (d) county councils; (e) city 8 governments; and (f) the work force training and education coordinating 9 board.
- 10 (3) The subcommittee shall meet as soon as is practicable and make 11 a preliminary report to the full committee, the governor, and the 12 appropriate standing committees of the legislature by September 15, 13 1993, and a final report before December 1, 1993.
- 14 (4) This section shall expire December 31, 1993.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. This act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the state government and its existing public institutions, and shall take effect immediately.
