- 1 AN ACT Relating to impersonation of a law enforcement officer;
- 2 amending RCW 9A.60.040; and prescribing penalties.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 9A.60.040 and 1975 1st ex.s. c 260 s 9A.60.040 are 5 each amended to read as follows:
- 6 (1) A person is guilty of criminal impersonation in the first 7 degree if ((he)) the person:
- 8 (a) Assumes a false identity and does an act in his <u>or her</u> assumed 9 character with intent to defraud another or for any other unlawful
- 10 purpose; or
- 11 (b) Pretends to be a representative of some person or organization
- 12 or a public servant and does an act in his or her pretended capacity
- 13 with intent to defraud another or for any other unlawful purpose.
- 14 (2) Criminal impersonation <u>in the first degree</u> is a gross 15 misdemeanor.
- 16 (3) A person is guilty of criminal impersonation in the second 17 degree if the person:
- 18 (a) Claims to be a law enforcement officer or creates an impression
- 19 that he or she is a law enforcement officer; and

- (b) Under circumstances not amounting to criminal impersonation in the first degree, does an act with intent to convey the impression that he or she is acting in an official capacity and a reasonable person would believe the person is a law enforcement officer.
- 5 (4) Criminal impersonation in the second degree is a misdemeanor.
