- 10 owner or occupant may sustain by reason of such trespass.
- 11 Sec. 2. RCW 16.24.140 and 1989 c 286 s 13 are each amended to read
- 12 as follows:
- 13 Upon claiming any animal impounded under this chapter, the owner
- 14 shall pay all costs of transportation, advertising, legal proceedings,
- 15 and keep of the animal, except as provided under section 3 of this act.
- 16 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 3.** A new section is added to chapter 16.04 RCW
- 17 to read as follows:

If damages are caused by a trespassing animal, neither the state 1 2 nor the owner of the animal shall be liable if the owner of the animal 3 can prove that the trespass is due to damage caused by wildlife to a 4 lawful fence and, in a stock restricted area, the owner of the animal 5 did not have a reasonable opportunity to repair the fence. The state shall pay all costs of transportation, advertising, legal proceedings, 6 and keep of an animal that has been restrained pursuant to RCW 8 16.04.010. Claims filed under this section shall be processed 9 according to the procedures under chapter 4.92 RCW.
