- 1 AN ACT Relating to the definition of hospital in regard to self-
- 2 insurers; and amending RCW 51.14.150.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 51.14.150 and 1983 c 174 s 2 are each amended to read 5 as follows:
- 6 (1) For the purposes of this section, "hospital" means a hospital
- 7 as defined in RCW 70.41.020(2) or a psychiatric hospital regulated
- 8 under chapter 71.12 RCW, but does not include beds utilized by a
- 9 <u>comprehensive cancer center for cancer research.</u>
- 10 (2)(a) Any two or more employers which are school districts or
- 11 educational service districts,  $((\frac{2}{2}))$  or (b) any two or more employers
- 12 which are hospitals((, as defined in RCW 70.39.020(3))), and are owned
- 13 or operated by a state agency or municipal corporation of this state,
- 14 or  $((\frac{3}{3}))$  (c) any two or more employers which are hospitals( $(\frac{3}{3})$ )
- 15 defined in RCW 70.39.020(3)), no one of which is owned or operated by
- 16 a state agency or municipal corporation of this state ((or subject to
- 17 RCW 70.39.150(3))), may enter into agreements to form self-insurance
- 18 groups for the purposes of this chapter((: PROVIDED, That)).

(3) No more than one group may be formed under subsection (2)(b) of this section and no more than one group may be formed under subsection  $((\frac{3}{2}))$  (2)(c) of this section.

(4) The self-insurance groups shall be organized and operated under rules promulgated by the director under RCW 51.14.160. Such a self-insurance group shall be deemed an employer for the purposes of this chapter, and may qualify as a self-insurer if it meets all the other requirements of this chapter.
