- 1 AN ACT Relating to assaults on fire investigators, fire inspectors,
- 2 and deputy state fire marshals; amending RCW 9A.36.031; and prescribing

- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 **Sec. 1.** RCW 9A.36.031 and 1990 c 236 s 1 are each amended to read 6 as follows:
- 7 (1) A person is guilty of assault in the third degree if he or she,
- 8 under circumstances not amounting to assault in the first or second
- 9 degree:
- 10 (a) With intent to prevent or resist the execution of any lawful
- 11 process or mandate of any court officer or the lawful apprehension or
- 12 detention of himself or another person, assaults another; or
- 13 (b) Assaults a person employed as a transit operator or driver by
- 14 a public or private transit company while that person is operating or
- 15 is in control of a vehicle that is owned or operated by the transit
- 16 company and that is occupied by one or more passengers; or
- 17 (c) Assaults a school bus driver employed by a school district or
- 18 a private company under contract for transportation services with a

- 1 school district while the driver is operating or is in control of a 2 school bus that is occupied by one or more passengers; or
- 3 (d) With criminal negligence, causes bodily harm to another person 4 by means of a weapon or other instrument or thing likely to produce 5 bodily harm; or
- 6 (e) Assaults a fire fighter or other employee of a fire department 7 or fire protection district who was performing his or her official 8 duties at the time of the assault; or
- 9 (f) With criminal negligence, causes bodily harm accompanied by 10 substantial pain that extends for a period sufficient to cause 11 considerable suffering; or
- 12 (g) Assaults a law enforcement officer or other employee of a law enforcement agency who was performing his or her official duties at the 14 time of the assault; or
- (h) Assaults a fire investigator, fire inspector, or deputy state fire marshal employed by a county fire prevention bureau, county fire marshal's office, or the department of community development.
- 18 (2) Assault in the third degree is a class C felony.
