
ENGROSSED SUBSTITUTE SENATE BILL 5605

- AN ACT Relating to roadside improvements; amending RCW 47.36.310;
- 2 and adding a new section to chapter 47.40 RCW.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 47.40 RCW 5 to read as follows:
- 6 The highway heritage account is created in the transportation fund.
- 7 Revenue from this account shall be appropriated to the department of
- 8 transportation and shall be used exclusively for grants to public
- 9 agencies and private nonprofit organizations (1) to allow citizens to
- 10 participate in comprehensive highway corridor programs, or (2) for
- 11 projects that preserve, enhance, provide information about, or improve
- 12 access to scenic, historical, or cultural features along state highways
- 13 and county roads. Use of this revenue to match federal or local
- 14 revenue available for purposes described in this section is a high
- 15 priority.
- 16 **Sec. 2.** RCW 47.36.310 and 1987 c 469 s 3 are each amended to read
- 17 as follows:

p. 1 ESSB 5605

The department is authorized to erect and maintain specific 1 information panels within the right of way of the interstate highway 2 3 system to give the traveling public specific information as to gas, 4 food, or lodging available on a crossroad at or near an interchange. Specific information panels shall include the words "GAS," "FOOD," or 5 "LODGING" and directional information and may contain one or more 6 7 individual business signs maintained on the panel. Specific 8 information panels are authorized within the corporate limits of cities 9 and towns and areas zoned for commercial or industrial uses at 10 locations where there is adequate distance between interchanges to ensure compliance with the provisions of Title 23 C.F.R. 11 655.307(a). The erection and maintenance of specific information 12 panels shall conform to the national standards promulgated by the 13 14 United States secretary of transportation pursuant to sections 131 and 15 315 of Title 23, United States Code and rules adopted by the state department of transportation. A motorist service business located 16 within one mile of a state highway shall not be permitted to display 17 its name, brand, or trademark on a specific information panel unless 18 19 its owner has first entered into an agreement with the department limiting the height of its on-premise signs at the site of its service 20 installation to not more than fifteen feet higher than the roof of its 21 main building. The department shall charge reasonable fees for the 22 display of individual business signs to defray the costs of their 23 24 installation and maintenance. <u>In addition, businesses shall pay an</u> annual fee of fifty dollars per mainline sign before an interchange to 25 26 be deposited in the highway heritage account created in section 1 of this act. The restriction for on-premise signs shall not apply if the 27 sign is not visible from the highway. The department may, on a case-28 29 by-case basis, waive the height restriction when an on-premise sign is 30 visible from the rural interstate system.
