- 1 AN ACT Relating to a geographic information council; adding new
- 2 sections to chapter 43.30 RCW; creating a new section; making an
- 3 appropriation; and providing an expiration date.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** The legislature declares:
- 6 (1) There is a need for a common base of geographic information and
- 7 organization to enable the information to be readily translatable,
- 8 retrievable, and geographically referenced for use by any state, local,
- 9 or governmental unit or utility;
- 10 (2) Property management, planning, risk assessments, and
- 11 environmental decision making at all levels of government and in the
- 12 private sector rely heavily on geographic information and various
- 13 mapping and surveying techniques;
- 14 (3) Many entities, both public and private, have similar needs and
- 15 overlapping requirements for geographic information;
- 16 (4) Many local, state, and federal government agencies and private
- 17 companies in Washington are now using computers to manage geographic
- 18 information; and

- 1 (5) There are many issues associated with the development, use,
- 2 maintenance, and exchange of and access to computer-based geographic
- 3 information.

- 4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 43.30 RCW 5 to read as follows:
  - (1) There is hereby created a geographic information council.
- 7 (2) The council shall consist of not more than twenty-three 8 representatives, and shall be composed of:
- 9 (a) One representative of higher education, appointed by the 10 council of presidents;
- 11 (b) Four representatives of local government, appointed as follows:
- 12 One by the Washington association of county officials; one by the
- 13 Washington state association of counties; and two by the association of
- 14 Washington cities;
- 15 (c) One tribal representative of the federally recognized Indian 16 tribes of Washington;
- 17 (d) One representative of the private sector, appointed by the 18 chair in consultation with an association representing business;
- 19 (e) One representative of the federal government, appointed by the 20 chair in consultation with the federal geographic data committee; and
- (f) One member representing the legislative branch of state government to be appointed jointly by the executive directors of the legislative service center and the legislative evaluation and
- 24 accountability program committee.
- The council shall elect one of its members to serve as chair. The
- 26 chair shall appoint the remaining fourteen members that shall represent
- 27 the regional government or private sectors. The regional
- 28 representation shall include the director or a designee from state
- 29 agencies having expertise and experience with geographic information
- 30 systems, including but not limited to representatives of the department
- 31 of wildlife, department of natural resources, department of information
- 32 services, department of transportation, department of social and health
- 33 services, and office of financial management.
- 34 (3) The council may create and appoint members to technical
- 35 advisory committees to assist the council in developing its
- 36 recommendations. The technical advisory committees shall reflect

- 1 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 3.** A new section is added to chapter 43.30 RCW
- 2 to read as follows:
- 3 The council is responsible for:
- 4 (1) The development of policy and standards for ensuring accuracy
- 5 and quality of geographic information;
- 6 (2) The development of policies and standards for data definitions 7 and data sharing;
- 8 (3) Identifying applications of geographic information to support 9 public service needs and decision-making capabilities;
- 10 (4) Recommending actions to meet geographic information needs in 11 the state of Washington;
- 12 (5) Fostering cooperation among federal, tribal, private, and local
- 13 and state government entities in using and sharing geographic
- 14 information;
- 15 (6) Serving as a forum for the exchange of educational information
- 16 and development of geographic information practices;
- 17 (7) Identifying mechanisms for funding the development of
- 18 geographic information;
- 19 (8) Specific steps, such as legislation, necessary to accomplish
- 20 subsections (1) through (7) of this section; and
- 21 (9) Identifying responsibilities for maintaining geographic
- 22 information data.
- 23 Information technology policies and standards shall be subject to
- 24 the review and approval by the information services board.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 4. The sum of . . . . dollars, or as much
- 26 thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated for the biennium ending
- 27 June 30, 1995, from the general fund to the department of natural
- 28 resources for the purpose of this act.
- 29 NEW SECTION. Sec. 5. This act expires June 30, 1999.
