AN ACT Relating to health care coverage for the immunization and vaccination of children; adding a new section to chapter 48.20 RCW; adding a new section to chapter 48.21 RCW; adding a new section to chapter 48.44 RCW; adding a new section to chapter 48.46 RCW; and creating a new section.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

7 The legislature finds that childhood NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. communicable diseases constitute a serious threat to the health of 8 children and that the prevention of these diseases is a readily 9 10 achievable goal; the effectiveness of childhood vaccinations to save lives and prevent debilitating disease has been well documented; 11 12 certain vaccinations are already required as a condition to entering 13 school in Washington; and the full immunization of all children 14 continues to be sound public policy.

Vaccination is among the most cost-effective components of preventive medical care, and it is in the financial best interest of the state and health care insurers to provide for the full immunization of all children. It is therefore the purpose of this act to require
