- 1 AN ACT Relating to transferring the Washington state energy office
- 2 to the department of community development; amending RCW 43.21F.025,
- 3 43.21F.035, and 42.17.2401; and creating new sections.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** The Washington state energy office is hereby
- 6 abolished and its powers, duties, and functions are hereby transferred
- 7 to the department of community development. All references to the
- 8 director or the Washington state energy office in the Revised Code of
- 9 Washington shall be construed to mean the director or the department of
- 10 community development.
- 11 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** All reports, documents, surveys, books,
- 12 records, files, papers, or written material in the possession of the
- 13 Washington state energy office shall be delivered to the custody of the
- 14 department of community development. All cabinets, furniture, office
- 15 equipment, motor vehicles, and other tangible property employed by the
- 16 Washington state energy office shall be made available to the
- 17 department of community development. All funds, credits, or other

- assets held by the Washington state energy office shall be assigned to the department of community development.
- Any appropriations made to the Washington state energy office 4 shall, on the effective date of this section, be transferred and 5 credited to the department of community development.
- Whenever any question arises as to the transfer of any personnel, funds, books, documents, records, papers, files, equipment, or other tangible property used or held in the exercise of the powers and the performance of the duties and functions transferred, the director of financial management shall make a determination as to the proper allocation and certify the same to the state agencies concerned.
- <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 3.** All employees of the Washington state energy 12 office are transferred to the jurisdiction of the department of 13 community development. All employees classified under chapter 41.06 14 15 RCW, the state civil service law, are assigned to the department of community development to perform their usual duties upon the same terms 16 as formerly, without any loss of rights, subject to any action that may 17 18 be appropriate thereafter in accordance with the laws and rules 19 governing state civil service.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 4. All rules and all pending business before the Washington state energy office shall be continued and acted upon by the department of community development. All existing contracts and obligations shall remain in full force and shall be performed by the department of community development.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 5. The transfer of the powers, duties, functions, and personnel of the Washington state energy office shall not affect the validity of any act performed prior to the effective date of this section.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 6. If apportionments of budgeted funds are required because of the transfers directed by sections 2 through 5 of this act, the director of financial management shall certify the apportionments to the agencies affected, the state auditor, and the state treasurer. Each of these shall make the appropriate transfer and adjustments in funds and appropriation accounts and equipment records in accordance with the certification.

- NEW SECTION. Sec. 7. Nothing contained in sections 1 through 6 of this act may be construed to alter any existing collective bargaining unit or the provisions of any existing collective bargaining agreement until the agreement has expired or until the bargaining unit has been modified by action of the personnel board as provided by law.
- 6 **Sec. 8.** RCW 43.21F.025 and 1987 c 330 s 501 are each amended to 7 read as follows:
- 8 (1) "Energy" means petroleum or other liquid fuels; natural or 9 synthetic fuel gas; solid carbonaceous fuels; fissionable nuclear material; electricity; solar radiation; geothermal resources; 10 hydropower; organic waste products; wind; tidal activity; any other 11 12 substance or process used to produce heat, light, or motion; or the savings from nongeneration technologies, including conservation or 13 14 improved efficiency in the usage of any of the sources described in 15 this subsection;
- (2) "Person" means an individual, partnership, joint venture, private or public corporation, association, firm, public service company, political subdivision, municipal corporation, government agency, public utility district, joint operating agency, or any other entity, public or private, however organized;

 - (4) "Office" means the Washington state energy office; and

- (5) "Distributor" means any person, private corporation, partnership, individual proprietorship, utility, including investorowned utilities, municipal utility, public utility district, joint operating agency, or cooperative, which engages in or is authorized to engage in the activity of generating, transmitting, or distributing energy in this state.
- 30 **Sec. 9.** RCW 43.21F.035 and 1990 c 12 s 1 are each amended to read 31 as follows:
- 32 The Washington state energy office is hereby created ((as an agency of state government)) as a part of the department of community development, responsible to the ((governor)) director and the legislature for carrying out the purposes of this chapter. The director shall be appointed by the governor with the consent of the senate and shall serve at the pleasure of the governor. The salary of
