- AN ACT Relating to abandoned vessels; amending RCW 63.21.080;
- 2 adding a new section to chapter 88.12 RCW; adding a new chapter to
- 3 Title 88 RCW; and repealing RCW 88.12.370.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** Unless the context clearly requires
- 6 otherwise, the definitions in this section apply throughout this
- 7 chapter.
- 8 (1) "Charges" means charges of the commission for moorage and
- 9 storage, and all other charges owing to or that become owing to the
- 10 commission, including but not limited to costs of securing, disposing,
- 11 or removing vessels, damages to any commission facility, and any costs
- 12 of sale and related legal expenses for implementing section 2 of this
- 13 act.
- 14 (2) "Commission" means the Washington state parks and recreation
- 15 commission.
- 16 (3) "Owner" means a person who has a lawful right to possession of
- 17 a vessel by purchase, exchange, gift, lease, inheritance, or legal
- 18 action whether or not the vessel is subject to a security interest, and
- 19 shall not include the holder of a security interest.

- 1 (4) "Person" means any natural person, firm, partnership, 2 corporation, association, organization, unit of state or local 3 government, or any other legal entity.
- 4 (5) "Commission facility" means any property or facility owned, 5 leased, operated, managed, or otherwise controlled by the commission or 6 by a person pursuant to a contract with the commission.
- 7 (6) "Secured vessel" means any vessel that has been secured by the 8 commission that remains in the commission's possession and control.
- 9 (7) "Unauthorized vessel" means a vessel using a commission 10 facility of any type whose owner has not paid the required moorage fees 11 or has left the vessel beyond the posted time limits, or a vessel 12 otherwise present without permission of the commission.
- 13 (8) "Vessel" means every watercraft or part thereof constructed, 14 used, or capable of being used as a means of transportation on the 15 water.
- Sec. 2. (1) The commission may take reasonable 16 NEW SECTION. measures, including but not limited to the use of anchors, chains, 17 18 ropes, and locks, or removal from the water, to secure unauthorized vessels located at or on a commission facility so that the unauthorized 19 vessels are in the possession and control of the commission. At least 20 ten days before securing any unauthorized vessel, the commission shall 21 send notification by registered mail to the last known address of the 22 23 last registered owner of the vessel and to the holder of a security 24 interest in the vessel. In the case of an unauthorized vessel where no 25 registration numbers are visible, or in the case of a vessel secured pursuant to subsection (2) of this section, the commission need not 26 give notice before securing the vessel. At the time of securing the 27 vessel under subsections (1) and (2) of this section, the commission 28 29 shall attach to the vessel a readily visible notice or, when 30 practicable, shall post such notice in a conspicuous location at the commission facility in the event the vessel is removed from the 31 premises. The notice shall be of a reasonable size and shall contain 32 33 the following information:
 - (a) The date and time the notice was attached;
- 35 (b) A statement that if the vessel is not removed within thirty 36 days it will be sold at public auction to satisfy the charges;

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- 1 (c) The address and telephone number where additional information 2 may be obtained concerning the storage of the vessel and conditions for 3 its release; and
- 4 (d) A description of the owner's or secured party's rights under 5 this chapter.
- (2) The commission may take reasonable measures, including but not 6 limited to the use of anchors, chains, ropes, locks, or removal from 7 8 the water, to secure any vessel if the vessel, in the opinion of the 9 commission, is a nuisance, is in danger of sinking or creating other 10 damage to the commission facility, or is otherwise a threat to the health, safety, or welfare of the public or environment at the 11 commission facility. The costs of any such procedure shall be paid by 12 13 the vessel's owner. At the time of securing any vessel under this subsection, the commission shall attach to the vessel or otherwise post 14 15 a readily visible notice in the manner and containing the information 16 required for securing unauthorized vessels under subsection (1) of this 17 section.
- (3) Within five days after a vessel is secured under subsection (1) 18 19 or (2) of this section, the commission shall make a reasonable effort 20 to notify the last registered owner, any lienholder of record, and any security interest holder of record by registered mail. 21 shall identify the vessel, indicate that the vessel was secured, 22 23 describe the owner's and secured party's rights under this chapter, and 24 indicate that the vessel will be deemed abandoned and subject to public 25 sale if not claimed within thirty days.
- 26 (4) If a vessel is secured under subsection (1) or (2) of this 27 section, the owner who is obligated to the commission for charges, or 28 the holder of a security interest in the vessel, may regain possession 29 of the vessel by:
- 30 (a) Making arrangements satisfactory to the commission for the 31 immediate removal of the vessel from the commission's control or for 32 authorized storage or moorage; and
- 33 (b) Making payment to the commission of all reasonable charges 34 incurred by the commission in securing the vessel under subsections (1) 35 and (2) of this section. If the owner fails to make payment of all 36 charges, the commission may bring an action in any court of competent 37 jurisdiction, which shall award the commission as much of the charges 38 as necessary to satisfy costs incurred by the commission under this

1 chapter, plus reasonable attorneys' fees and costs incurred by the 2 commission.

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- (5) A vessel that is not claimed within thirty days of the date of notification under subsection (3) of this section is abandoned. A vessel abandoned at a commission facility may, in the discretion of the commission, be disposed of by public sale of the vessel by authorized personnel to the highest and best bidder for cash as follows:
- 8 (a) Before the vessel is sold, the commission shall make a 9 reasonable effort to notify the vessel owner, any lienholder of record, 10 and any security interest holder of record at least twenty days prior to the sale in the manner set forth in subsection (3) of this section 11 if the names and addresses of such persons are known. The notice shall 12 13 contain the time and place of the sale, a reasonable description of the vessel to be sold, the amount of charges then owing with respect to the 14 15 vessel, and a summary of the rights and procedures under this chapter. 16 A notice of sale shall be published at least once, more than ten but 17 not more than twenty days before the sale, in a newspaper of general circulation in the county in which the commission facility is located. 18 19 This notice shall include the name of the vessel, if any, the last 20 known owner and address, and a reasonable description of the vessel to be sold. The commission may bid all or part of its charges at the sale 21 22 and may become a purchaser at the sale.
 - (b) Before the vessel is sold, any person seeking to redeem a secured vessel under this section may commence a lawsuit in the superior court for the county in which the vessel was secured to contest the commission's decision to secure the vessel or the amount of charges owing. This lawsuit shall be commenced within fifteen days of the date the notification was sent pursuant to subsection (3) of this section, or the right to a hearing is deemed waived and the owner is liable for any charges owing the commission. In the event of litigation, the prevailing party is entitled to reasonable attorneys' fees and costs.
- 33 (c) The proceeds of a sale under this section shall be applied 34 first to the payment of reasonable charges incurred by the commission 35 then to the owner or to satisfy any liens of record or security 36 interests of record on the vessel in the order of their priority. If 37 the owner cannot in the exercise of due diligence be located by the 38 commission within one year of the date of the sale, any excess funds 39 from the sale, following the satisfaction of any bona fide security

- 1 interest, shall revert to the department of revenue under chapter 63.29
- 2 RCW. If the sale is for a sum less than the applicable charges, the
- 3 commission is entitled to assert a claim for the deficiency against the
- 4 vessel owner.
- 5 (d) In the event no one purchases the vessel at a sale, or a vessel
- 6 is not removed from the commission facility or other arrangements are
- 7 not made within ten days of sale, the commission may proceed to
- 8 otherwise properly dispose of the vessel, and may assert a claim
- 9 against the owner for any charges incurred thereby. In the event that
- 10 the vessel is otherwise disposed of under this subsection, any proceeds
- 11 from the disposal shall be applied pursuant to subsection (5)(c) of
- 12 this section.
- 13 (6) The rights granted to the commission under this section are in
- 14 addition to any other legal rights the commission may have to secure,
- 15 hold, and sell a vessel and in no manner does this section alter those
- 16 rights, or affect the priority of other liens on a vessel.
- 17 **Sec. 3.** RCW 63.21.080 and 1985 c 7 s 125 are each amended to read
- 18 as follows:
- 19 This chapter shall not apply to:
- 20 (1) Motor vehicles under chapter 46.52 RCW;
- 21 (2) Unclaimed property in the hands of a bailee under chapter 63.24
- 22 RCW; ((and))
- 23 (3) Uniform disposition of unclaimed property under chapter 63.29
- 24 RCW; and
- 25 (4) Secured vessels under chapter 88.-- RCW (sections 1 and 2 of
- 26 this act).
- 27 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 4.** RCW 88.12.370 and 1989 c 393 s 2 are each
- 28 repealed.
- 29 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 5.** A new section is added to chapter 88.12 RCW
- 30 to read as follows:
- The provisions of RCW 88.12.185 through 88.12.225 do not apply to
- 32 vessels secured pursuant to chapter 88.-- RCW (sections 1 and 2 of this
- 33 act).
- 34 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 6.** Sections 1 and 2 of this act shall
- 35 constitute a new chapter in Title 88 RCW.
