- 1 AN ACT Relating to establishing the Washington manufacturing
- 2 extension center; adding a new section to chapter 43.330 RCW; adding a
- 3 new section to chapter 28B.50 RCW; adding a new chapter to Title 24
- 4 RCW; and creating a new section.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 6 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** (1) The legislature finds that:
- 7 (a) To perform in the emerging global marketplace, Washington firms
- 8 must master new technologies, production processes, and methods of work
- 9 organization, all of which demand substantial improvement in worker
- 10 skills;
- 11 (b) Only through modernization can Washington firms both compete
- 12 successfully in the market of the future and pay good wages;
- 13 (c) Most Washington firms are not exposed to the potential benefits
- 14 of flexible, high-performance work organizations demanding highly
- 15 skilled workers;
- 16 (d) There are few mechanisms for most firms to learn from the
- 17 experiences of high performance firms and few models of inter-firm
- 18 cooperation in modernization; and

- 1 (e) To be effective, any program to improve the capability of 2 Washington firms must reflect the specific needs and capabilities of 3 those firms.
- 4 (2) It is the intent of the legislature that the state increase its support for delivery of modernization services to targeted sectors of 5 the Washington economy and leverage federal and private resources 6 7 devoted to such efforts. The purpose of this act is to assist in 8 meeting the modernization needs of targeted industry sectors and to 9 support the formation and growth of the Washington manufacturing 10 extension center. It is the further intent of the legislature that the Washington manufacturing extension center coordinate the delivery of 11 modernization services and act as a catalyst to: 12
- 13 (a) Increase inter-firm cooperation in important sectors of the 14 state's economy;
- 15 (b) Encourage small and medium-sized firms to aggregate their 16 demand for training and other modernization services, thus driving down 17 the cost to the individual firm and securing more effective services; 18 and
- (c) Encourage large firms to support training consortia among their suppliers, share their training facilities, and validate the importance of high performance work organization and workplace learning as desirable supplier practices.
- NEW SECTION. **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 43.330 RCW to read as follows:
- 25 (1) In carrying out the targeted sector assistance authorized under 26 RCW 43.330.090, the department shall work with the state board for 27 community and technical colleges to assist in the operation of the Washington manufacturing extension center, consistent with this section 28 29 and sections 3, 4, and 5 of this act. The department shall: 30 Assist the Washington center in applying for federal and private grants; (b) jointly conduct with the center a state-wide planning 31 process to determine the modernization needs of key industry sectors 32 33 geographic regions and optimum mechanisms for delivering and modernization services; and (c) contract with the center for delivery 34 of client-directed problem-solving services that will assist the 35 36 modernization efforts of firms, industry associations, networks, and consortiums in targeted sectors. 37

- 1 (2) The department shall report annually on the effectiveness of 2 the center to the governor and the appropriate legislative committees.
- 3 (3) In carrying out the requirements of this section, the 4 department shall make use of the expertise available to it as a member 5 of USNet and available from other federally funded modernization 6 projects in the state.
- 7 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 3.** A private, not-for-profit corporation shall be organized with the assistance of the department of community, trade, 8 9 and economic development and the state board for community and technical colleges, under Title 24 RCW and this section and sections 2, 10 4, and 5 this act, to be known as the Washington manufacturing 11 extension center. The mission of the center shall be to operate a 12 13 modernization extension system, coordinate a network of public and 14 private modernization resources, and stimulate the competitiveness of 15 firms within targeted business sectors of Washington's economy. center shall jointly conduct with the department of community, trade, 16 and economic development a state-wide planning process to determine the 17 18 modernization needs of key industry sectors and geographic regions and 19 optimum mechanisms for delivering modernization services. The center shall initially target firms in the aerospace, electronics, and related 20 21 industries in the central Puget Sound area of the state.
- 22 NEW_SECTION. Sec. 4. The Washington manufacturing extension 23 center shall be a membership organization. A majority of the board of 24 directors of the Washington manufacturing extension center shall be composed of representatives of small and medium-sized manufacturing 25 firms and industry associations, networks, or consortiums. 26 27 shall also include at least two members representing labor unions or 28 labor councils and, as ex-officio members, the director of the department of community, trade, and economic development, the director 29 of the state board for community and technical colleges, and the 30 director of the work force training and education coordinating board. 31 32 The board of directors' authority includes, but is not limited to, the 33 authority to:
 - (1) Set membership dues for its members;

35 (2) Charge fees for services, make and execute contracts with any 36 individual, corporation, association, public agency, or any other 37 entity, and employ all other legal instruments necessary or convenient

- 1 for the performance of its duties and the exercise of its powers and 2 functions under this section and sections 2, 3, and 5 of this act;
- 3 (3) Receive funds from federal, state, or local governments, 4 private businesses, foundations, or any other source for purposes 5 consistent with this section and sections 2, 3, and 5 of this act;
- 6 (4) Develop policies, plans, and programs to assist in the 7 modernization of businesses in targeted sectors of Washington's 8 economy;
- 9 (5) Provide information about the advantages of modernization and 10 evaluative information on the modernization services available from the 11 center to federal, state, and local governments, state colleges and 12 universities, and private providers;
- 13 (6) Collaborate with the Washington quality initiative in the 14 development of manufacturing quality standards and quality 15 certification programs;
- 16 (7) Establish a training program for network brokers and other 17 modernization service providers; and
- 18 (8) Provide, either directly or through contracts, assistance to 19 industry associations, networks, or consortiums, that would be of value 20 to their member firms in:
- 21 (a) Adopting advanced business management practices such as 22 strategic planning and total quality management;
- 23 (b) Developing mechanisms for inter-firm collaboration and 24 cooperation;
- (c) Appraising, purchasing, installing, and effectively using equipment, technologies, and processes that improve the quality of goods and services and the productivity of the firm;
- (d) Improving human resource systems and work force training in a manner that moves firms toward flexible, high-performance work organizations;
- 31 (e) Developing new products;
- 32 (f) Market research, analysis, and development of new sales 33 channels and export markets; and
- 34 (g) Improving credit, capital management, and business finance 35 skills.
- NEW SECTION. **Sec. 5.** A new section is added to chapter 28B.50 RCW to read as follows:

- The state board for community and technical colleges shall: (1) 1 Assist in the establishment of the Washington manufacturing extension 2 center; and (2) develop competency-based technical degree programs to 3 4 be offered by community and technical colleges serving modernizing firms. The programs shall include quality management training and 5 assist small and medium-sized firms in the development of work-based 6 learning to enhance the skills and knowledge of workers performing 7 8 modern work processes. The programs shall prepare new entrants to 9 technical and managerial jobs in manufacturing in ways that meet the 10 needs of firms that have chosen to modernize via high-performance work organizations. 11
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 6. Sections 3 and 4 of this act shall constitute a new chapter in Title 24 RCW.
