- 1 AN ACT Relating to health and safety; adding a new section to

- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 4.24 RCW 6 to read as follows:
- 7 (1) A manufacturer of tobacco products shall be strictly liable for
- 8 health injuries caused by inhaling, ingesting, chewing, or applying
- 9 tobacco products or smoke from tobacco products.
- 10 (2) To recover under this section it is not a requirement that the
- 11 injured party show active use or participation in the use of a tobacco
- 12 product.
- 13 (3) Evidence of contributory fault is inadmissible under this
- 14 section.
- 15 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 70.54 RCW
- 16 to read as follows:

p. 1 SB 6407

- 1 (1) Except as provided in subsection (3) of this section, tobacco 2 products may not be sold or distributed in those portions of buildings 3 or vessels that are publicly owned or leased.
- 4 (2) A violation of this section is grounds for the termination or 5 nonrenewal of a contract for occupancy or rental of any area of any 6 publicly owned or leased building or vessel.
- 7 (3) This section does not apply to correctional institutions. 8 However, the secretary of corrections or a local correctional 9 institution authority may prohibit sales and distributions of tobacco
- 10 products if the prohibition applies equally to employees and inmates.
- NEW SECTION. **Sec. 3.** A new section is added to chapter 70.160 RCW to read as follows:
- 13 This chapter does not preempt local regulation of indoor smoking 14 that is as restrictive or more restrictive than this chapter.
- 15 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 4.** Section 2 of this act shall take effect 16 January 1, 1995.
