- 1 AN ACT Relating to legislator-teachers; adding a new section to
- 2 chapter 28A.320 RCW; and creating a new section.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** Education has become much more demanding,
- 5 difficult, and complex. Public and legislative expectations for the
 - education of our children are high but often create additional
- 7 pressures for the performance of educators. It is more important than
- 8 ever that persons who want to help improve the education system have an
- 9 understanding of the realities of teaching today. Toward that end, it
- 10 is the intent of this act to encourage legislators to spend time in
- 11 schools in teaching roles.

- 12 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 28A.320
- 13 RCW to read as follows:
- 14 (1) Any legislator may teach so long as such service is performed
- 15 under the general supervision of a certificated instructional staff.
- 16 For the purposes of this section, general supervision may include the
- 17 legislator teaching without the certificated instructional staff being
- 18 in the classroom but being in the building and readily available. It

- 1 is the joint responsibility of the legislator, school district, 2 principal, and teacher to determine what the legislator will teach.
- 3 (2) Subject to the limitations under subsection (3) of this 4 section, legislators may claim no more than two days per diem per year 5 for teaching under subsection (1) of this section, however the 6 legislator must teach at least four hours of the day for which per diem 7 is claimed.
- 8 (3) Any legislator holding a valid Washington state teaching 9 certificate shall be:
- (a) Eligible to claim per diem under subsection (2) of this section only if the legislator is on an unpaid leave from a school district or is not under contract with a school district; and
- 13 (b) Ineligible to claim these days for service credit for state 14 retirement system purposes.
- 15 (4) The state board of education may adopt such rules as are 16 necessary to implement this section.
