- 1 AN ACT Relating to the mandatory use of recycled paper; adding new
- 2 sections to chapter 2.28 RCW; adding a new section to chapter 34.05
- 3 RCW; creating a new section; and providing an effective date.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** The legislature finds that there is a need
- 6 to expand upon existing laws which foster the effective and efficient
- 7 management of solid waste by requiring that certain documents submitted
- 8 by attorneys at law to state courts of record be submitted on recycled
- 9 paper. The legislature further finds that increased recycling will
- 10 protect and enhance the environment and economy of Washington state.
- 11 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 2.28 RCW
- 12 to read as follows:
- 13 Unless the context clearly requires otherwise, the definitions in
- 14 this section apply throughout sections 2 through 4 of this act.
- 15 (1) "Attorney" means an attorney at law admitted to practice law
- 16 before any court of record in this state.
- 17 (2) "Document" means a pleading or other paper submitted as an
- 18 appendix to the pleading by an attorney, which document is required or

- 1 permitted to be filed with a clerk of court concerning an action to be 2 commenced or that is pending before a court of record.
- 3 (3) "Recycled paper" means paper with not less than fifty percent
- 4 of its total weight consisting of secondary and postconsumer waste and
- 5 with not less than ten percent of such total weight consisting of
- 6 postconsumer waste.
- 7 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 3.** A new section is added to chapter 2.28 RCW
- 8 to read as follows:
- 9 (1) Except as provided in subsection (3) of this section, an
- 10 attorney may not submit a document to a court of record after January
- 11 1, 1995, unless the document is submitted on recycled paper. This
- 12 section applies to all papers appended to the document.
- 13 (2) Procedures adopted to implement this section may not impede
- 14 the conduct of court business nor create grounds for an additional
- 15 cause of action or sanction.
- 16 (3) A court of record may not refuse a document solely because the
- 17 document was not submitted on recycled paper.
- 18 (a) This section does not apply to:
- 19 (i) A photograph;
- 20 (ii) An original document that was prepared or printed before
- 21 January 1, 1995;
- 22 (iii) A document that was not created at the direction or under the
- 23 control of the submitting attorney;
- 24 (iv) A facsimile copy otherwise permitted to be filed with a court
- 25 of record in lieu of the original document. However, if the original
- 26 is also required to be filed, the original must be submitted in
- 27 compliance with this section; and
- 28 (v) Existing stock of nonrecycled paper and preprinted forms
- 29 acquired or printed before January 1, 1994.
- 30 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 4.** A new section is added to chapter 34.05 RCW
- 31 to read as follows:
- 32 (1) Except as provided in subsection (3) of this section, an
- 33 attorney may not submit a document concerning an adjudicatory
- 34 proceeding after January 1, 1995, unless the document is submitted on
- 35 recycled paper. This section applies to all papers appended to the
- 36 document.

- 1 (2)(a) A state agency that adopts policies, procedures, rules, or 2 regulations for the purpose of implementing this section shall ensure 3 that the conduct of state business is not impeded and that a person is 4 not denied access to the services or programs of a state agency as a 5 result of the implementation.
- 6 (b) A state agency may not refuse a document solely because it was 7 not submitted on recycled paper.
- 8 (3) This section does not apply to:
- 9 (a) A photograph:
- 10 (b) An original document that was prepared or printed before 11 January 1, 1995;
- 12 (c) A document that was not created by the direction or under the 13 control of the submitting attorney;
- 14 (d) A facsimile copy concerning an adjudicatory proceeding 15 otherwise permitted to be filed in lieu of the original document.
- 16 However, if the original is also required to be filed, the original
- 17 must be submitted in compliance with this section; and
- 18 (e) Existing stock of nonrecycled paper and preprinted forms 19 acquired before January 1, 1994.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 5. This act shall take effect July 1, 1994.
