- 1 AN ACT Relating to nomenclature of educational clinics; and
- 2 amending RCW 28A.205.010, 28A.205.020, 28A.205.030, 28A.205.050,
- 3 28A.205.060, 28A.205.070, 28A.205.080, and 28A.205.090;
- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 Sec. 1. RCW 28A.205.010 and 1990 c 33 s 180 are each amended to 6 read as follows:
- 7 (1) As used in this chapter, unless the context thereof shall clearly indicate to the contrary: 8
- ((Educational clinic)) "Education center" means any private school 9 10 operated on a profit or nonprofit basis which does the following:
- 11 (a) Is devoted to the teaching of basic academic skills, including
- 12 specific attention to improvement of student motivation for achieving,
- 13 and employment orientation.
- 14 (b) Operates on a clinical, client centered basis. This shall
- 15 include, but not be limited to, performing diagnosis of individual
- educational abilities, determination and setting of individual goals, 16
- prescribing and providing individual courses of instruction therefor, 17
- and evaluation of each individual client's progress in his or her 18
- 19 educational program.

- 1 (c) Conducts courses of instruction by professionally trained 2 personnel certificated by the state board of education according to 3 rules and regulations promulgated for the purposes of this chapter and 4 providing, for certification purposes, that a year's teaching 5 experience in an ((educational clinic)) education center shall be 6 deemed equal to a year's teaching experience in a common or private 7 school.
- 8 (2) For purposes of this chapter, basic academic skills shall 9 include the study of mathematics, speech, language, reading and 10 composition, science, history, literature and political science or 11 civics; it shall not include courses of a vocational training nature 12 and shall not include courses deemed nonessential to the accrediting of 13 the common schools or the approval of private schools under RCW 14 28A.305.130.
- 15 (3) The state board of education shall certify an education ((clinic)) center only upon application and (a) determination that such 16 school comes within the definition thereof as set forth in subsection 17 (1) above and (b) demonstration on the basis of actual educational 18 19 performance of such applicants' students which shows after consideration of their students' backgrounds, educational gains that 20 are a direct result of the applicants' educational program. 21 certification may be withdrawn if the board finds that a ((clinic)) 22 23 center fails to provide adequate instruction in basic academic skills. 24 No ((educational clinic)) education center certified by the state board 25 of education pursuant to this section shall be deemed a common school 26 under RCW 28A.150.020 or a private school for the purposes of RCW 28A.195.010 through 28A.195.050. 27
- 28 **Sec. 2.** RCW 28A.205.020 and 1990 c 33 s 181 are each amended to 29 read as follows:
- 30 Only eligible common school dropouts shall be enrolled in a certified ((educational clinic)) education center for reimbursement by 31 superintendent of public instruction as provided in RCW 32 33 28A.205.040. No person shall be considered an eligible common school 34 dropout who (1) has completed high school, (2) who has not reached his or her thirteenth birthday or has passed his or her twentieth birthday, 35 36 or (3) shows proficiency beyond the high school level in a test approved by the superintendent of public instruction to be given as 37 part of the initial diagnostic procedure, or (4) until one month has 38

passed after he or she has dropped out of any common school and the 1 ((educational clinic)) education center has 2 received written verification from a school official of the common school last attended 3 4 in this state that such person is no longer in attendance at such school, unless such ((clinic)) center has been requested to admit such 5 person by written communication of the board of directors or its 6 7 designee, of that common school, or unless such person is unable to 8 attend a particular common school because of disciplinary reasons, 9 including suspension and/or expulsion therefrom. The fact that any 10 person may be subject to RCW 28A.225.010 through 28A.225.150, 28A.200.010, and 28A.200.020 shall not affect his or her qualifications 11 as an eligible common school dropout under this chapter. 12

13 **Sec. 3.** RCW 28A.205.030 and 1990 c 33 s 182 are each amended to 14 read as follows:

The superintendent of public instruction shall adopt, by rules, 15 policies and procedures to permit a prior common school dropout to 16 reenter at the grade level appropriate to such individual's ability: 17 18 PROVIDED, That such individual shall be placed with the class he or she 19 would be in had he or she not dropped out and graduate with that class, if the student's ability so permits notwithstanding any loss of credits 20 prior to reentry and if such student earns credits at the normal rate 21 22 subsequent to reentry.

Notwithstanding any other provision of law, any certified ((educational clinic)) education center student, upon completion of an individual student program and irrespective of age, shall be eligible to take the general educational development test as given throughout the state.

28 **Sec. 4.** RCW 28A.205.050 and 1990 c 33 s 184 are each amended to 29 read as follows:

In accordance with chapter 34.05 RCW, the administrative procedure act, the state board of education with respect to the matter of certification, and the superintendent of public instruction with respect to all other matters, shall have the power and duty to make the necessary rules and regulations to carry out the purpose and intent of this chapter.

36 Criteria as promulgated by the state board of education or 37 superintendent of public instruction for determining if any

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- 1 ((educational clinic)) education center is providing adequate
- 2 instruction in basic academic skills or demonstrating superior
- 3 performance in student educational gains for funding under RCW
- 4 28A.205.040 shall be subject to review by four members of the
- 5 legislature, one from each caucus of each house, including the chairs
- 6 of the respective education committees.
- 7 **Sec. 5.** RCW 28A.205.060 and 1985 c 434 s 2 are each amended to 8 read as follows:
- 9 The superintendent of public instruction shall prepare a report on ((educational clinics)) education centers that:
- 11 (1) Identifies a funding level that is adequate to fund the 12 enrollment served by ((educational clinics)) education centers during
- 13 the previous fiscal year;
- 14 (2) Identifies locales in the state which are served by
- 15 ((educational clinics)) education centers but where demand for
- 16 ((educational clinic)) education center services will support
- 17 additional service, and recommends the funding level necessary to serve
- 18 such demand;
- 19 (3) Identifies locales in the state which are not served by
- 20 (($\frac{\text{educational clinics}}{\text{oducation centers}}$ but where demand will support
- 21 operation of ((clinics)) centers, and recommends the funding level
- 22 necessary to serve such demand; and
- 23 (4) Identifies locales in the state that are either underserved or
- 24 not served by existing public school programs for drop-outs or for
- 25 drop-out prevention, but where demand will support such services and
- 26 recommends the funding level necessary to serve such demand.
- 27 The report shall be submitted to the legislature by January 1 in
- 28 the year following June 27, 1985, and updates of the report shall be
- 29 submitted with each biennial budget request until such time as funding
- 30 levels reach the levels recommended in subsections (2) and (3) of this
- 31 section.
- 32 **Sec. 6.** RCW 28A.205.070 and 1990 c 33 s 185 are each amended to
- 33 read as follows:
- In allocating funds appropriated for ((educational clinics))
- 35 <u>education centers</u>, the superintendent of public instruction shall:

- 1 (1) Place priority upon stability and adequacy of funding for 2 ((educational clinics)) education centers that have demonstrated 3 superior performance as defined in RCW 28A.205.040(2).
- 4 (2) Initiate and maintain a competitive review process to select 5 new or expanded ((clinic)) center programs in unserved or underserved 6 areas. The criteria for review of competitive proposals for new or 7 expanded education((clinic)) center services shall include but not be 8 limited to:
- 9 (a) The proposing organization shall have obtained certification 10 from the state board of education as provided in RCW 28A.205.010;
- 11 (b) The cost-effectiveness of the proposal ((as judged by the 12 criteria established in RCW 28A.97.100(1) and (2))); and
- 13 (c) The availability of committed nonstate funds to support, 14 enrich, or otherwise enhance the basic program.
- 15 (3) In selecting areas for new or expanded ((educational clinics))
 16 education center programs, the superintendent of public instruction
 17 shall consider factors including but not limited to:
- 18 (a) The proportion and total number of dropouts unserved by 19 existing ((clinics)) center programs, if any;
- (b) The availability within the geographic area of programs other than ((educational clinics)) education centers which address the basic educational needs of dropouts; and
- 23 (c) Waiting lists or other evidence of demand for expanded 24 ((educational clinic)) education center programs.
- 25 (4) In the event of any curtailment of services resulting from 26 lowered legislative appropriations, the superintendent of public instruction shall issue pro rata reductions to all ((clinics)) centers 27 28 funded at the time of the lowered appropriation. 29 ((clinics)) centers may be exempted from such pro rata reductions if 30 the superintendent finds that such reductions would impair the 31 ((clinic's)) center's ability to operate at minimally acceptable levels of service. In the event of such exceptions, the superintendent shall 32 determine an appropriate rate for reduction to permit the ((clinic)) 33 34 <u>center</u> to continue operation.
- (5) In the event that an additional ((clinic or clinics)) center or centers become certified and apply to the superintendent for funds to be allocated from a legislative appropriation which does not increase from the immediately preceding biennium, or does not increase sufficiently to allow such additional ((clinic or clinics)) center or

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- 1 <u>centers</u> to operate at minimally acceptable levels of service without
- 2 reducing the funds available to previously funded ((clinics)) centers,
- 3 the superintendent shall not provide funding for such additional
- 4 ((clinic or clinics)) center or centers from such appropriation.
- 5 **Sec. 7.** RCW 28A.205.080 and 1990 c 33 s 186 are each amended to 6 read as follows:
- 7 The legislature recognizes that ((educational clinics)) education
- 8 <u>centers</u> provide a necessary and effective service for students who have
- 9 dropped out of common school programs. ((Educational clinics))
- 10 Education centers have demonstrated success in preparing such youth for
- 11 productive roles in society and are an integral part of the state's
- 12 program to address the needs of students who have dropped out of
- 13 school. The superintendent of public instruction shall distribute
- 14 funds, consistent with legislative appropriations, allocated
- 15 specifically for ((educational clinics)) education centers in accord
- 16 with chapter 28A.205 RCW. The legislature encourages school districts
- 17 to explore cooperation with ((educational clinics)) education centers.
- 18 **Sec. 8.** RCW 28A.205.090 and 1990 c 33 s 187 are each amended to 19 read as follows:
- 20 The superintendent shall include the ((educational clinics))
- 21 <u>education centers</u> program in the biennial budget request. Contracts
- 22 between the superintendent of public instruction and the ((educational
- 23 clinics)) education centers shall include quarterly plans which provide
- 24 for relatively stable student enrollment but take into consideration
- 25 anticipated seasonal variations in enrollment in the individual
- 26 ((clinics)) centers. Funds which are not expended by a ((clinic))
- 27 <u>center</u> during the quarter for which they were planned may be carried
- 28 forward to subsequent quarters of the fiscal year. The superintendent
- 29 shall make payments to the ((clinics)) centers on a monthly basis
- 30 pursuant to RCW 28A.205.040.

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
