1 AN ACT Relating to transportation appropriations; amending RCW 2 47.86.030, 82.44.020, and 81.112.030; amending 1991 sp.s. c 15 s 4 (uncodified); amending 1992 c 166 s 8 (uncodified); amending 1992 c 166 3 4 s 9 (uncodified); amending 1992 c 166 s 20 (uncodified); reenacting and 5 amending RCW 46.16.070, 81.112.030, 43.89.010, and 82.44.180; adding a new section to chapter 46.01 RCW; creating new sections; repealing RCW 6 7 47.86.010, 47.86.020, 47.86.030, 47.86.035, 47.86.040, 47.86.050, 47.86.060, 47.86.900, and 47.86.901; making appropriations; providing 8 effective dates; and declaring an emergency.

#### 10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

11 The transportation budget of the state is NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. 12 hereby adopted and, subject to the provisions hereinafter set forth, 13 the several amounts hereinafter specified, or as much thereof as may be 14 necessary to accomplish the purposes designated, are 15 appropriated from the several accounts and funds hereinafter named to the designated state agencies and offices for salaries, wages, and 16 17 other expenses, for capital projects, and for other specified purposes, including the payment of any final judgments arising out of such 18 activities, for the period ending June 30, 1995. 19

Any bill enacted during the 1993 legislative session requiring expenditure from a transportation-related fund or account that was not heard by either of the transportation committees is not funded in this act.

- 12 (1) The appropriation from the public safety and education account

- The appropriations in this section are provided for the location, design, right of way, and construction of state highway projects designated as category "A" under RCW 47.05.030. The appropriations in this section are subject to the following conditions and limitations:
  - (1) Up to \$650,000 of the motor vehicle fund--state appropriation is provided solely for an inventory of drainage facilities; analysis of water sources entering the Washington department of transportation facilities; testing for contaminants; analyzing the flow of discharged stormwater; and developing a prioritization system that will enable the department to evaluate proposed construction projects with regard to their effects on sensitive water bodies.

The appropriations in this section are provided for the location, design, right of way, and construction of state highway projects on the interstate system designated as category "B" under RCW 47.05.030. The appropriations in this section are subject to the following conditions and limitations:

- 1 (1) The motor vehicle fund--state appropriation includes a maximum of \$50,800,000 in proceeds from the sale of bonds authorized by RCW 47.10.790 and 47.10.801. However, the transportation commission may authorize the use of current revenues available to the department of transportation in lieu of bond proceeds for any part of the state appropriation.
  - (2) Should cash flow demands exceed the motor vehicle fund--federal appropriation, the motor vehicle fund--state appropriation is increased proportionally to provide matching state funds from the sale of bonds authorized by RCW 47.10.801 and 47.10.790 not to exceed \$10,000,000 and it is understood that the department shall seek authority to expend unanticipated receipts for the federal portion.

- 6 years from the date of the first election on a system plan, the board
- 7 may, by resolution, reconstitute the authority as a single-county body.
- 8 With a two-thirds vote of the entire membership of the voting members,
- 9 the board may also dissolve the authority.
- 10 **Sec. 63.** RCW 43.89.010 and 1965 ex.s. c 60 s 2 are each amended to 11 read as follows:
- 12 The chief of the Washington state patrol is hereby authorized to
- 13 establish a teletypewriter communications network which will inter-
- 14 connect the law enforcement agencies of the state and its political
- 15 subdivisions into a unified written communications system. The chief
- 16 of the Washington state patrol is authorized to lease or purchase such
- 17 facilities and equipment as may be necessary to establish and maintain
- 18 such teletypewriter communications network.
- 19 (1) The communications network shall be used exclusively for the
- 20 official business of the state, and the official business of any city,

- 22 (2) This section does not prohibit the occasional use of the

- 31 the state shall bear at least fifty percent of the costs of such
- 32 service as its share in providing a modern unified communications
- 33 network to the law enforcement agencies of the state. Of the fees
- 34 collected pursuant to this section, one-half shall be deposited in the
- 35 motor vehicle fund and one-half shall be deposited in the
- 36 <u>transportation fund</u>.
- 37 (4) The chief of the Washington state patrol is authorized to
- 38 arrange for the connection of the communications network with the law

- 1 enforcement communications system of any adjacent state, or the
- 2 Province of British Columbia, Canada.
- 3 **Sec. 64.** RCW 82.44.180 and 1991 c 199 s 224 are each amended to 4 read as follows:
- 5 (1) The transportation fund is created in the state treasury.
- 6 Revenues under RCW 82.44.020 (1) and (2), 82.44.110, 82.44.150, and the
- 7 surcharge under RCW 82.50.510 shall be deposited into the fund as
- 8 provided in those sections.
- 9 Moneys in the fund may be spent only after appropriation.
- 10 Expenditures from the fund may be used only for transportation purposes
- 11 and activities and operations of the Washington state patrol not

- 23 (c) Public transportation system contributions required to fund
- 24 projects approved by the transportation improvement board.
- 25 (3) There is hereby created the public transportation systems
- 26 account within the transportation fund. Moneys deposited into the
- 27 account under RCW 82.44.150(2)(c) shall be available to the public
- 28 transportation system from which the funds are derived, solely for:
- 29 (a) Development of high capacity transportation systems as defined
- 30 in RCW ((<del>81.104.010</del>)) <u>81.104.015</u>;
- 31 (b) Development of high occupancy vehicle lanes and related
- 32 facilities as defined in RCW 81.100.020;
- 33 (c) Other public transportation system-related roadway projects on
- 34 state highways, county roads, or city streets; and
- 35 (d) Public transportation system contributions required to fund
- 36 projects approved by the transportation improvement board.

- 1 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 65.** This act is necessary for the immediate
- 2 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the
- 3 state government and its existing public institutions, and shall take
- 4 effect immediately except for sections 60 and 61, which shall take
- 5 effect January 1, 1994.
- 6 NEW SECTION. Sec. 66. Chapter 102, Laws of 1993 and chapter 123,
- 7 Laws of 1993 each take effect January 1, 1994.
