- 1 AN ACT Relating to an interstate compact for restoration of native

- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 75.40 RCW
- 6 to read as follows:
- 7 The state of Washington is authorized to enter into an interstate
- 8 compact or compacts with all or any of the states of California, Idaho,
- 9 and Oregon to protect and restore coastal ecosystems of these states to
- 10 levels that will prevent the need for listing any native salmonid fish
- 11 species under the federal endangered species act of 1973, as amended,
- 12 or under any comparable state legislation.
- 13 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 75.40 RCW
- 14 to read as follows:
- 15 Until such time as the agencies in California, Idaho, Oregon, and
- 16 Washington present a final proposed interstate compact for enactment by
- 17 their respective legislative bodies, the governor may establish
- 18 cooperative agreements with the states of California, Idaho, and Oregon

- 1 that allow the states to coordinate their individual efforts in
- 2 developing state programs that further the region-wide goals set forth
- 3 under section 1 of this act.
- 4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 3.** This act shall take effect July 1, 1994.
