1            AN ACT Relating to defining "employment" for unemployment  
2 compensation; adding a new section to chapter 50.04 RCW; providing an  
3 effective date; and declaring an emergency.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5            NEW SECTION.    **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 50.04 RCW  
6 to read as follows:

7            The term "employment" does not include services performed by a  
8 massage practitioner licensed under chapter 18.108 RCW in a massage  
9 business if the use of the business facilities is contingent upon  
10 compensation to the owner of the business facilities and the person  
11 receives no compensation from the owner for the services performed.

12            NEW SECTION.    **Sec. 2.** This act is necessary for the immediate  
13 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the  
14 state government and its existing public institutions, and takes effect  
15 July 1, 1993.
