1 AN ACT Relating to recreational trails; and amending RCW 67.32.110.

2 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

3 **Sec. 1.** RCW 67.32.110 and 1970 ex.s. c 76 s 11 are each amended to
4 read as follows:

5 The IAC is authorized and encouraged to consult and to cooperate
6 with any state, federal or local governmental agency or body including
7 special districts subject to the provisions of chapter 85.38 RCW, with
8 private landowners, and with any privately owned utility having
9 jurisdiction or control over or information concerning the use,
10 abandonment or disposition of roadways, utility rights-of-way, dikes or
11 levees, or other properties suitable for the purpose of improving or
12 expanding the system in order to assure, to the extent practicable,
13 that any such properties having value for state recreation trail
14 purposes may be made available for such use.
