- AN ACT Relating to accelerant detection dogs; amending RCW 4.24.410
- 2 and 9A.76.200; and prescribing penalties.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 Sec. 1. RCW 4.24.410 and 1989 c 26 s 1 are each amended to read as 5 follows:
 - (1) As used in this section:
- 7 (a) "Police dog" means a dog used by a law enforcement agency 8 specially trained for law enforcement work and under the control of a
- 9 dog handler.

- 10 (b) "Accelerant detection dog" means a dog used exclusively for
- 11 accelerant detection by the state fire marshal or a fire department and
- 12 under the control of the state fire marshal or his or her designee or
- 13 a fire department handler.
- 14 (c) "Dog handler" means a law enforcement officer who has
- 15 successfully completed training as prescribed by the Washington state
- 16 criminal justice training commission in police dog handling, or in the
- 17 case of an accelerant detection dog, the state fire marshal's designee
- 18 or an employee of the fire department authorized by the fire chief to
- 19 be the dog's handler.

- 1 (2) Any dog handler who uses a police dog in the line of duty in 2 good faith is immune from civil action for damages arising out of such 3 use of the police dog <u>or accelerant detection dog</u>.
- 4 Sec. 2. RCW 9A.76.200 and 1989 c 26 s 2 are each amended to read 5 as follows:
- 6 (1) A person is guilty of harming a police dog <u>or accelerant</u>
 7 <u>detection dog</u> if he <u>or she</u> maliciously injures, disables, shoots, or
 8 kills by any means any dog that the person knows or has reason to know
 9 to be a police dog <u>or accelerant detection dog</u>, as defined in RCW
 10 4.24.410, whether or not the dog is actually engaged in police <u>or accelerant detection</u> work at the time of the injury.
- 12 (2) Harming a police dog <u>or accelerant detection dog</u> is a class C 13 felony.
