- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- MEW SECTION. Sec. 1. Unless the context clearly requires otherwise, the definitions in this section apply throughout this
- 6 chapter.
- 7 (1) "Distributing organization" means a charitable nonprofit
- 8 organization under 26 U.S.C. Sec. 501(c) of the federal internal
- 9 revenue code which distributes children's items to needy persons free
- 10 of charge and includes any nonprofit organization that distributes
- 11 children's items free of charge to other nonprofit organizations or the
- 12 public.
- 13 (2) "Donor" means a person, corporation, association, or other
- 14 organization that donates children's items to a distributing
- 15 organization or a person, corporation, association, or other
- 16 organization that repairs or updates such donated items to current
- 17 standards. Donor also includes any person, corporation, association,
- 18 or other organization which donates any space in which storage or
- 19 distribution of children's items takes place.

- 1 (3) "Children's items" include, but are not limited to, clothes,
- 2 diapers, food, baby formula, cribs, playpens, car seat restraints,
- 3 toys, high chairs, and books.
- 4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** Donors and distributing organizations are
- 5 not liable for civil damages or criminal penalties resulting from the
- 6 nature, age, condition, or packaging of the donated children's items
- 7 unless a donor or distributing organization acts with gross negligence
- 8 or intentional misconduct.
- 9 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 3.** Nothing in this chapter may be construed to
- 10 create any liability of, or penalty against a donor or distributing
- 11 organization except as provided in section 2 of this act.
- 12 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 4.** If any provision of this act or its
- 13 application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the
- 14 remainder of the act or the application of the provision to other
- 15 persons or circumstances is not affected.
- 16 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 5.** Sections 1 through 4 of this act shall
- 17 constitute a new chapter in Title 70 RCW.
