12 From the state ferry terminal at Port Townsend via the state ferry 13 system northeasterly to the state ferry terminal at Keystone; also

14 From the Keystone ferry dock on Whidbey Island, thence 15 northeasterly by the most feasible route by way of Deception Pass, 16 Burlington, Sedro Woolley, Concrete, Newhalem, Winthrop, Twisp, Okanogan, Tonasket, Republic, Kettle Falls, Colville, and Tiger; thence 17 18 southerly and southeasterly to a junction with state route number 2 at 19 Newport.

Nothing in this chapter precludes the refund of all vehicle license fees and motor vehicle fuel tax directly or indirectly paid by the residents of those counties composed entirely of islands and that have neither a fixed physical connection with the mainland nor any state highways on any of the islands of which they are composed, as authorized under RCW 46.68.080.
