1 AN ACT Relating to nonsalmon delivery licenses; and amending RCW
2 75.28.020.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 75.28.020 and 1993 c 340 s 4 are each amended to read
5 as follows:

6 (1) Except as otherwise provided in this title, a person as defined
7 in RCW 75.08.011 may hold a commercial license established by this
8 chapter.

9 (2) Except as otherwise provided in this title, an individual may
10 hold a commercial license only if the individual is sixteen years of
11 age or older and a bona fide resident of the United States.

12 (3) A corporation may hold a commercial license only if it is
13 authorized to do business in this state.

14 (4) No person may hold a limited-entry license unless the person
15 meets the qualifications that this title establishes for the license.

16 (5) The residency requirements in subsection (2) of this section do
17 not apply to holders of nonsalmon delivery licenses.
