1 AN ACT Relating to preservation of rights under prior lien laws;
2 adding a new section to chapter 60.04 RCW; providing a retroactive
3 effective date; and declaring an emergency.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 60.04 RCW
6 to read as follows:

7 All rights acquired and liabilities incurred under acts or parts of
8 act repealed by chapter 281, Laws of 1991, are hereby preserved, and
9 all actions pending as of June 1, 1992, shall proceed under the law as
10 it existed at the time chapter 281, Laws of 1991, took effect.

11 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 2.** This act is remedial in nature and shall be
12 applied retroactively to June 1, 1992.

13 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 3.** This act is necessary for the immediate
14 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the
15 state government and its existing public institutions, and shall take
16 effect immediately.
