1 AN ACT Relating to emergency medical service district volunteer 2 benefits; amending RCW 41.24.010; and adding new sections to chapter 3 41.24 RCW.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 Sec. 1. RCW 41.24.010 and 1989 c 91 s 8 are each amended to read 6 as follows:

7 As used in this chapter:

8 "Municipal corporation" or "municipality" includes any city or 9 town, fire protection district, or any water, irrigation, or other 10 district, authorized by law to afford <u>emergency medical services or</u> 11 protection to life and property within its boundaries from fire.

"Fire department" means any regularly organized fire department <u>or</u> <u>emergency medical service district</u> consisting wholly of volunteer fire fighters, or any part-paid and part-volunteer fire department duly organized and maintained by any municipality: PROVIDED, That any such municipality wherein a part-paid fire department is maintained may by appropriate legislation permit the full-paid members of its department to come under the provisions of chapter 41.16 RCW.

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"Fire fighter" includes any fire fighter or emergency worker who is a member of any fire department of any municipality but shall not include full time, paid fire fighters who are members of the Washington law enforcement officers' and fire fighters' retirement system, with respect to periods of service rendered in such capacity.

6 <u>"Emergency worker" means any emergency medical service personnel,</u> 7 regulated by chapters 18.71 and 18.73 RCW, who is a member of an 8 emergency medical service district but shall not include full-time, 9 paid emergency medical service personnel who are members of the 10 Washington public employees' retirement system, with respect to periods 11 of service rendered in such capacity.

"Performance of duty" shall be construed to mean and include any work in and about company quarters or any fire station or any other place under the direction or general orders of the chief or other officer having authority to order such member to perform such work; responding to, working at, or returning from an alarm of fire; drill; or any work performed of an emergency nature in accordance with the rules and regulations of the fire department.

19 "State board" means the state board for volunteer fire fighters 20 created herein.

21 <u>"Board of trustees" means a board of trustees created under RCW</u>
22 <u>41.24.060 or, for matters affecting an emergency worker, an emergency</u>
23 <u>medical service district board of trustees created under section 2 of</u>
24 <u>this act.</u>

25 "Appropriate legislation" means an ordinance when an ordinance is 26 the means of legislating by any municipality, and resolution in all 27 other cases.

<u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 2. In every county maintaining a regularly 28 29 organized emergency medical service district there is hereby created an 30 emergency medical service district board of trustees for the administration of this chapter. The emergency medical service district 31 32 board shall consist of three of the members of the county legislative 33 authority or their designees, the county auditor or the auditor's 34 designee, the head of the emergency medical service district, and one emergency worker from the emergency medical service district to be 35 36 elected by the emergency workers of the emergency medical service district for a term of one year and annually thereafter. 37

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1 Sec. 3. The chair of the board of county NEW SECTION. commissioners shall be chair of the emergency medical service district 2 board of trustees, and the county clerk shall be the secretary-3 treasurer of the emergency medical service district board of trustees. 4 The secretary shall keep a public record of all proceedings, of all 5 receipts and disbursements made by the emergency medical service 6 7 district board of trustees and shall make an annual report of its expenses and disbursements with a full list of the beneficiaries of 8 said fund in the county, the record to be placed on file in the county. 9 10 Such forms as shall be necessary for the proper administration of this fund and of making the reports required hereunder shall be provided by 11 the state board. 12

The state board shall set the amount 13 NEW SECTION. Sec. 4. 14 consistent with the most recent valuation of the volunteer fire fighters relief and pension fund to be paid for the purposes of this 15 chapter by emergency medical service districts for emergency worker 16 relief and pension fees and by emergency workers for emergency worker 17 18 pensions. The fees set under this section are subject to the other provisions of this chapter. 19

20 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 5.** Sections 2 through 4 of this act are each 21 added to chapter 41.24 RCW.
