1 AN ACT Relating to the size and weight of motor vehicles; and 2 amending RCW 46.44.0941 and 46.44.030.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 Sec. 1. RCW 46.44.0941 and 1993 c 102 s 4 are each amended to read 5 as follows:

6 The following fees, in addition to the regular license and tonnage 7 fees, shall be paid for all movements under special permit made upon 8 state highways. All funds collected, except the amount retained by 9 authorized agents of the department as provided in RCW 46.44.096, shall 10 be forwarded to the state treasury and shall be deposited in the motor 11 vehicle fund:

The department may issue any of the above-listed permits that involve height, length, or width for an expanded period of consecutive months, not to exceed one year.

The fees levied in this section and RCW 46.44.095 do not apply to vehicles owned and operated by the state of Washington, a county within the state, a city or town or metropolitan municipal corporation within
the state, or the federal government.

3 Sec. 2. RCW 46.44.030 and 1993 c 301 s 1 are each amended to read 4 as follows:

5 It is unlawful for any person to operate upon the public highways 6 of this state any vehicle having an overall length, with or without 7 load, in excess of forty feet. This restriction does not apply to (1) 8 a municipal transit vehicle, (2) auto stage, private carrier bus or 9 school bus with an overall length not to exceed forty-six feet, or (3) 10 an articulated auto stage with an overall length not to exceed sixty-11 one feet.

12 It is unlawful for any person to operate on the highways of this 13 state any combination of vehicles that contains a vehicle in excess of 14 forty-eight feet, with or without load.

15 It is unlawful for any person to operate upon the public highways 16 of this state any combination consisting of a tractor and semitrailer 17 that has a semitrailer length in excess of ((forty-eight)) fifty-three 18 feet or a combination consisting of a tractor and two trailers in which 19 the combined length of the trailers exceeds sixty-one feet, with or 20 without load.

It is unlawful for any person to operate on the highways of this state any combination consisting of a truck and trailer with an overall length, with or without load, in excess of seventy-five feet. However, a combination of vehicles transporting automobiles or boats may have a front overhang of three feet and a rear overhang of four feet beyond this allowed length.

These length limitations do not apply to vehicles transporting 27 poles, pipe, machinery, or other objects of a structural nature that 28 cannot be dismembered and operated by a public utility when required 29 for emergency repair of public service facilities or properties, but in 30 respect to night transportation every such vehicle and load thereon 31 shall be equipped with a sufficient number of clearance lamps on both 32 33 sides and marker lamps upon the extreme ends of any projecting load to 34 clearly mark the dimensions of the load.

The length limitations described in this section are exclusive of safety and energy conservation devices, such as mud flaps and splash and spray suppressant devices, refrigeration units or air compressors, and other devices that the department determines to be necessary for

- 1 safe and efficient operation of commercial vehicles. No device
- 2 excluded under this paragraph from the limitations of this section may
- 3 have, by its design or use, the capability to carry cargo.
