1            AN ACT Relating to load regulations for ready-mix mixer trucks; and  
2 adding a new section to chapter 46.44 RCW.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4            NEW SECTION.    **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 46.44 RCW  
5 to read as follows:

6            The switch that controls the raising and lowering of the  
7 retractable rear booster or tag axle on a ready-mix cement truck may be  
8 located within the reach of the driver's compartment as long as the  
9 variable control, used to adjust axle loadings by regulating air  
10 pressure or by other means, is out of the reach of the driver's  
11 compartment.
