1 AN ACT Relating to the acceptance and disbursement of funds and
2 grants by the liquor control board; and amending RCW 66.08.050.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 66.08.050 and 1986 c 214 s 2 are each amended to read
5 as follows:

6 The board, subject to the provisions of this title and the
7 regulations, shall

8 (1) determine the localities within which state liquor stores shall
9 be established throughout the state, and the number and situation of
10 the stores within each locality;

11 (2) appoint in cities and towns and other communities, in which no
12 state liquor store is located, liquor vendors. Such liquor vendors
13 shall be agents of the board and be authorized to sell liquor to such
14 persons, firms or corporations as provided for the sale of liquor from
15 a state liquor store, and such vendors shall be subject to such
16 additional rules and regulations consistent with this title as the
17 board may require;

1 (3) establish all necessary warehouses for the storing and
2 bottling, diluting and rectifying of stocks of liquors for the purposes
3 of this title;

4 (4) provide for the leasing for periods not to exceed ten years of
5 all premises required for the conduct of the business; and for
6 remodeling the same, and the procuring of their furnishings, fixtures,
7 and supplies; and for obtaining options of renewal of such leases by
8 the lessee. The terms of such leases in all other respects shall be
9 subject to the direction of the board;

10 (5) determine the nature, form and capacity of all packages to be
11 used for containing liquor kept for sale under this title;

12 (6) execute or cause to be executed, all contracts, papers, and
13 documents in the name of the board, under such regulations as the board
14 may fix;

15 (7) pay all customs, duties, excises, charges and obligations
16 whatsoever relating to the business of the board;

17 (8) require bonds from all employees in the discretion of the
18 board, and to determine the amount of fidelity bond of each such
19 employee;

20 (9) perform services for the state lottery commission to such
21 extent, and for such compensation, as may be mutually agreed upon
22 between the board and the commission;

23 (10) accept and deposit into the general fund-local account and
24 disburse, subject to appropriation, federal grants or other funds or
25 donations from any source for the purpose of improving public awareness
26 of the health risks associated with alcohol consumption by youth and
27 the abuse of alcohol by adults in Washington state. The board's
28 alcohol awareness program shall cooperate with federal and state
29 agencies, interested organizations, and individuals to effect an active
30 public beverage alcohol awareness program;

31 (11) perform all other matters and things, whether similar to the
32 foregoing or not, to carry out the provisions of this title, and shall
33 have full power to do each and every act necessary to the conduct of
34 its business, including all buying, selling, preparation and approval
35 of forms, and every other function of the business whatsoever, subject
36 only to audit by the state auditor: PROVIDED, That the board shall
37 have no authority to regulate the content of spoken language on
38 licensed premises where wine and other liquors are served and where

1 there is not a clear and present danger of disorderly conduct being
2 provoked by such language.
