1            AN ACT Relating to residential habilitation centers; amending RCW  
2 71A.20.020; creating a new section; and declaring an emergency.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4            **Sec. 1.** RCW 71A.20.020 and 1988 c 176 s 702 are each amended to  
5 read as follows:

6            The following residential habilitation centers are permanently  
7 established to provide services to persons with developmental  
8 disabilities: (~~Interlake School, located at Medical Lake, Spokane~~  
9 ~~county~~)) Lakeland Village, located at Medical Lake, Spokane county;  
10 Rainier School, located at Buckley, Pierce county; Yakima Valley  
11 School, located at Selah, Yakima county; Fircrest School, located at  
12 Seattle, King county; and Frances Haddon Morgan Children's Center,  
13 located at Bremerton, Kitsap county.

14            **\*NEW SECTION.**    *Sec. 2. The legislature shall consider the*  
15 *amendment or repeal of RCW 71A.20.020 following the submission of the*  
16 *report by the secretary of the department of social and health services*  
17 *required by chapter . . . . (House Bill No. 2163), Laws of 1994.*

18 *\*Sec. 2 was vetoed, see message at end of chapter.*

1        NEW SECTION.    **Sec. 3.**    This act is necessary for the immediate  
2 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the  
3 state government and its existing public institutions, and shall take  
4 effect immediately.

      Passed the House February 11, 1994.

      Passed the Senate March 1, 1994.

      Approved by the Governor April 1, 1994, with the exception of  
          certain items which were vetoed.

      Filed in Office of Secretary of State April 1, 1994.

1        Note: Governor's explanation of partial veto is as follows:

2        "I am returning herewith, without my approval as to section 2,  
3 Substitute House Bill No. 2164 entitled:

4        "AN ACT Relating to residential habilitation centers;"

5        Substitute House Bill No. 2164 removes Interlake School from the  
6 list of permanently established Residential Habilitation Centers in RCW  
7 71A.20.020. Section 2 of the bill states that the legislature will  
8 consider further amendment or the repeal of RCW 71A.20.020 contingent  
9 on a Department of Social and Health Services study directed in  
10 proposed House Bill No. 2163. The department intends to complete such  
11 a study. However, as House Bill No. 2163 was not enacted, I am vetoing  
12 section 2 of the bill.

13        With the exception of section 2, Substitute House Bill No. 2164 is  
14 approved."
