- AN ACT Relating to the digging of razor clams for persons with
- 2 physical disability permits; and amending RCW 75.25.080.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 75.25.080 and 1989 c 305 s 4 are each amended to read 5 as follows:
- 6 (1) It is lawful to dig the personal-use daily bag limit of razor 7 clams for another person if that person has in possession a physical 8 disability permit issued by the director.
- 9 (2) An application for a physical disability permit must be 10 submitted on a department of fisheries official form and must be 11 accompanied by a licensed medical doctor's certification of disability.
- 12 (3) A person with a physical disability permit is not required to
- 13 <u>be present at the location where another person is digging razor clams</u>
- 14 for the disabled person. The physical disability permittee is required
- 15 to be in the direct line of sight of the person digging razor clams for
- 16 him or her, unless it is not possible to be in a direct line of sight
- 17 because of a physical obstruction or other barrier. If such a barrier
- 18 or obstruction exists, the physical disability permittee is required to

- 1 be within one-quarter mile of the person who is digging razor clams for
- 2 <u>him or her.</u>
