- 1 AN ACT Relating to abandoned cemeteries; and amending RCW
- 2 68.60.030.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 68.60.030 and 1990 c 92 s 3 are each amended to read 5 as follows:
- 6 (1)(a) The archaeological and historical division of the department
- 7 of community development may grant by nontransferable certificate
- 8 authority to maintain and protect an abandoned cemetery upon
- 9 application made by a preservation organization which has been
- 10 incorporated for the purpose of restoring, maintaining, and protecting
- 11 an abandoned cemetery. Such authority shall be limited to the care,
- 12 maintenance, restoration, protection, and historical preservation of
- -- maintenance, rescentieren, procession, and inspection processing
- 13 the abandoned cemetery, and shall not include authority to make
- 14 burials, unless specifically granted by the cemetery board.
- 15 (b) Those preservation and maintenance corporations that are
- 16 granted authority to maintain and protect an abandoned cemetery shall
- 17 be entitled to hold and possess burial records, maps, and other
- 18 historical documents as may exist. Maintenance and preservation
- 19 corporations that are granted authority to maintain and protect an

- 1 abandoned cemetery shall not be liable to those claiming burial rights,
- 2 ancestral ownership, or to any other person or organization alleging to
- 3 have control by any form of conveyance not previously recorded at the
- 4 county auditor's office within the county in which the abandoned
- 5 cemetery exists. Such organizations shall not be liable for any
- 6 reasonable alterations made during restoration work on memorials,
- 7 roadways, walkways, features, plantings, or any other detail of the
- 8 abandoned cemetery.
- 9 <u>(c)</u> Should the maintenance and preservation corporation be dissolved, the archaeological and historical division of the department of community development shall revoke the certificate of authority.
- (d) Maintenance and preservation corporations that are granted authority to maintain and protect an abandoned cemetery may establish care funds pursuant to chapter 68.44 RCW, and shall report in accordance with chapter 68.44 RCW to the state cemetery board.
- (2) Except as provided in subsection (1) of this section, the 16 department of community development may, in its sole discretion, 17 authorize any Washington nonprofit corporation that is not expressly 18 19 incorporated for the purpose of restoring, maintaining, and protecting an abandoned cemetery, to restore, maintain, and protect one or more 20 abandoned cemeteries. The authorization may include the right of 21 access to any burial records, maps, and other historical documents, but 22 shall not include the right to be the permanent custodian of original 23 24 records, maps, or documents. This authorization shall be granted by a nontransferable certificate of authority. Any nonprofit corporation 25 26 authorized and acting under this subsection is immune from liability to the same extent as if it were a preservation organization holding a 27 certificate of authority under subsection (1) of this section. 28
- 29 (3) The department of community development shall establish 30 standards and guidelines for granting certificates of authority under 31 subsections (1) and (2) of this section to assure that any restoration, 32 maintenance, and protection activities authorized under this subsection 33 are conducted and supervised in an appropriate manner.
