- 1 AN ACT Relating to surcharges for recording documents; and amending
- 2 RCW 36.22.170.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 36.22.170 and 1989 c 204 s 3 are each amended to read 5 as follows:
- 6 A surcharge of two dollars per instrument shall be charged by the
- 7 county auditor for each document recorded, which will be in addition to
- 8 any other charge authorized by law. Fifty percent of the revenue
- 9 generated through this surcharge shall be transmitted monthly to the
- 10 state treasurer who shall distribute such funds to each county
- 11 treasurer within the state in July of each year in accordance with the
- 12 formula described in RCW 36.22.190. The county treasurer shall place
- 13 the funds received in a special account titled the auditor's centennial
- 14 document preservation and modernization account to be used solely for
- 15 ((the purpose authorized by this chapter)) ongoing preservation of
- 16 <u>historical documents of all county offices and departments</u> and shall
- 17 not be added to the county current expense fund. Fifty percent of the
- 18 revenue generated by this surcharge shall be retained by the county and
- 19 deposited in the auditor's operation and maintenance fund for ongoing

- 1 preservation of historical documents <u>of all county offices and</u> 2 <u>departments</u>. ((The portion of the surcharge transmitted to the state
- 3 treasurer shall expire January 1, 1995, at which time the surcharge
- 4 authorized in this section shall be reduced to one dollar per
- 5 instrument.))
- The centennial document preservation and modernization account is hereby created in the custody of the state treasurer and shall be
- 8 classified as a treasury trust account. State distributions from the
- 9 centennial document preservation and modernization account shall be
- 10 made without appropriation.
