- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 35.21 RCW 6 to read as follows:
- 7 No city or town shall enact or enforce an ordinance or regulation
- 8 that fails to conform to the limited preemption entitled "Amateur Radio
- 9 Preemption, 101 FCC 2nd 952 (1985)" issued by the federal
- 10 communications commission. An ordinance or regulation adopted by a
- 11 city or town with respect to amateur radio antennas shall conform to
- 12 the limited federal preemption, that states local regulations that
- 13 involve placement, screening, or height of antennas based on health,
- 14 safety, or aesthetic considerations must be crafted to reasonably
- 15 accommodate amateur communications, and to represent the minimal
- 16 practicable regulation to accomplish the local authority's legitimate
- 17 purpose.

NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. A new section is added to chapter 35A.21 RCW to read as follows:

3 No code city shall enact or enforce an ordinance or regulation that 4 fails to conform to the limited preemption entitled "Amateur Radio 5 Preemption, 101 FCC 2nd 952 (1985)" issued by the federal communications commission. An ordinance or regulation adopted by a 6 7 code city with respect to amateur radio antennas shall conform to the 8 limited federal preemption, that states local regulations that involve placement, screening, or height of antennas based on health, safety, or 9 10 aesthetic considerations must be crafted to reasonably accommodate amateur communications, and to represent the minimal practicable 11 12 regulation to accomplish the local authority's legitimate purpose.

NEW SECTION. Sec. 3. A new section is added to chapter 36.32 RCW to read as follows:

15 No county shall enact or enforce an ordinance or regulation that fails to conform to the limited preemption entitled "Amateur Radio 16 101 2nd 952 (1985)" issued by 17 Preemption, FCC the federal 18 communications commission. An ordinance or regulation adopted by a 19 county with respect to amateur radio antennas shall conform to the limited federal preemption, that states local regulations that involve 20 placement, screening, or height of antennas based on health, safety, or 21 aesthetic considerations must be crafted to reasonably accommodate 22 23 amateur communications, and to represent the minimal practicable 24 regulation to accomplish the local authority's legitimate purpose.

NEW SECTION. Sec. 4. This act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the state government and its existing public institutions, and shall take effect immediately.
