- 1 AN ACT Relating to the joint legislative systems committee; and
- 2 amending RCW 44.68.020.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 44.68.020 and 1986 c 61 s 2 are each amended to read 5 as follows:
- 6 (1) The joint legislative systems committee is created to oversee
- 7 the direction of the information processing and communications systems
- 8 of the legislature and to enforce the policies, procedures, and
- 9 standards established under this chapter. The systems committee
- 10 consists of ((eight)) four members as follows:
- 11 (a) ((The speaker of the house of representatives;
- 12 (b) The minority leader of the house of representatives;
- (c)) A member from each of the two largest caucuses in the house
- 14 of representatives, appointed by the speaker of the house of
- 15 representatives;
- 16 ((d) The majority leader of the senate;
- 17 (e) The minority leader of the senate;)) and
- 18 $((\frac{f}{f}))$ A member from each of the two largest caucuses in the
- 19 senate, appointed by the majority leader of the senate.

- 1 (2) ((The initial members of the systems committee shall be appointed within five days after March 12, 1986, and shall serve until 2 their successors are appointed and qualified in the 1987 regular 3 4 legislative session. After the initial terms,)) <u>Members shall serve</u> two-year terms, beginning with their appointment in the regular 5 legislative session held in an odd-numbered year and continuing until 6 7 their successors are appointed and qualified. In case of a vacancy, 8 the original appointing authority shall appoint another member of the 9 same party as the vacating member.
- 10 (3) The systems committee shall choose its own presiding officer 11 and other necessary officers from among its membership, and shall make 12 rules for orderly procedure.
