- 1 AN ACT Relating to institutions of higher education collegiate
- 2 license plates; amending RCW 46.16.301, 46.16.313, 46.16.332, and
- 3 46.16.381; adding a new section to chapter 46.04 RCW; adding a new
- 4 section to chapter 46.16 RCW; adding a new section to chapter 28B.10
- 5 RCW; creating a new section; repealing RCW 46.16.323; and prescribing
- 6 penalties.
- 7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 8 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 46.04 RCW
- 9 to read as follows:
- 10 "Collegiate license plates" means license plates that display a
- 11 depiction of the name and mascot or symbol of a state university,
- 12 regional university, or state college as defined in RCW 28B.10.016.
- 13 **Sec. 2.** RCW 46.16.301 and 1990 c 250 s 1 are each amended to read
- 14 as follows:
- 15 (1) The department may create, design, and issue special license
- 16 plates((, upon terms and conditions as may be established by the
- 17 department,)) that may be used in lieu of regular or personalized
- 18 license plates ((upon)) for motor vehicles required to display two

- 1 motor vehicle license plates, excluding vehicles registered under
- 2 chapter 46.87 RCW, upon terms and conditions established by the
- 3 <u>department</u>. The special plates may:
- 4 (a) Denote the age or type of vehicle; or ((may))
- 5 <u>(b) Denote special activities or interests((-,)); or</u>
- 6 (c) Denote the status, or contribution or sacrifice for the United
- 7 States, the state of Washington, or the citizens of the state of
- 8 Washington, of a registered owner of that vehicle; or
- 9 (d) Display a depiction of the name and mascot or symbol of a state
- 10 university, regional university, or state college as defined in RCW
- 11 <u>28B.10.016</u>.
- 12 (2) The department has the sole discretion to determine whether or
- 13 not to create, design, or issue any series of special license plates
- 14 and whether any ((activity,)) interest or status((, contribution, or
- 15 sacrifice)) merits the issuance of a series of special license plates.
- 16 In making this determination, the department shall consider whether or
- 17 not an ((activity or)) interest ((proposed)) or status contributes or
- 18 has contributed significantly to the public health, safety, or welfare
- 19 of the citizens of the United States or of this state or to their
- 20 significant benefit, or whether the ((activity,)) interest((-
- 21 contribution, or sacrifice)) or status is recognized by the United
- 22 States, this state, or other states, in other settings or contexts.
- 23 The department may also consider the potential number of persons who
- 24 may be eligible for the plates and the cost and efficiency of producing
- 25 limited numbers of the plates. The design of a special license plate
- 26 shall conform to all requirements for plates for the type of vehicle
- 27 for which it is issued, as provided elsewhere in this chapter.
- 28 NEW SECTION. Sec. 3. A new section is added to chapter 46.16 RCW
- 29 to read as follows:
- 30 Effective January 1, 1995, a state university, regional university,
- 31 or state college as defined in RCW 28B.10.016 may apply to the
- 32 department, in a form prescribed by the department, and request the
- 33 department to issue a series of collegiate license plates depicting the
- 34 name and mascot or symbol of the college or university, as submitted
- 35 and approved for use by the requesting institution.
- 36 **Sec. 4.** RCW 46.16.313 and 1990 c 250 s 4 are each amended to read
- 37 as follows:

- (1) The department may establish a fee for ((the issuance of)) each 1 2 type of special license ((plate or)) plates <u>issued under RCW</u> 46.16.301(1) (a), (b), or (c) in an amount calculated to offset the 3 4 cost of production of the special license ((plate or)) plates and the administration of this program. The fee shall not exceed thirty-five 5 dollars and is in addition to all other fees required to register and 6 7 license the vehicle for which the plates have been requested. All such 8 additional special license plate fees collected by the department shall 9 be deposited in the state treasury and credited to the motor vehicle 10 fund.
- (2) In addition to all fees and taxes required to be paid upon 11 application, registration, and renewal registration of a motor vehicle, 12 the holder of a collegiate license plate shall pay a fee of thirty 13 dollars. The department shall deduct an amount not to exceed two 14 15 dollars of each fee collected under this subsection for administration and collection expenses incurred by it. The remaining proceeds, minus 16 the cost of plate production, shall be remitted to the custody of the 17 state treasurer with a proper identifying detailed report. The state 18 19 treasurer shall credit the funds to the appropriate collegiate license plate fund as provided in section 7 of this act. 20
- 21 **Sec. 5.** RCW 46.16.332 and 1990 c 250 s 9 are each amended to read 22 as follows:
- (1) The director may adopt fees to be charged by the department for emblems issued by the department under RCW 46.16.319 ((and 46.16.323)).

- shall be in an amount sufficient to offset the costs of production of remembrance emblems and the administration of that program by the department plus an amount for use by the department of veterans affairs, not to exceed a total fee of twenty-five dollars per emblem. ((The fee for each special vehicle license plate emblem issued under RCW 46.16.323 shall be an amount sufficient to offset the cost of production of the emblems and of administering the special vehicle license plate emblem program.))
- (3) The veterans' emblem account is created in the custody of the state treasurer. All receipts by the department from the issuance of remembrance emblems under RCW 46.16.319 shall be deposited into this fund. Expenditures from the fund may be used only for the costs of production of remembrance emblems and administration of the program by

- 1 the department of licensing, with the balance used only by the
- 2 department of veterans affairs for projects that pay tribute to those
- 3 living veterans and to those who have died defending freedom in our
- 4 nation's wars and conflicts and for the upkeep and operations of
- 5 existing memorials, as well as for planning, acquiring land for, and
- 6 constructing future memorials. Only the director of licensing, the
- 7 director of veterans affairs, or their designees may authorize
- 8 expenditures from the fund. The fund is subject to allotment
- 9 procedures under chapter 43.88 RCW, but no appropriation is required
- 10 for expenditures.
- 11 $((\frac{4}{\text{ The special vehicle license plate emblem account is}})$
- 12 established in the state treasury. Fees collected by the department
- 13 for emblems issued under RCW 46.16.323 shall be deposited into the
- 14 special vehicle license plate emblem account to be used only to offset
- 15 the costs of administering the special vehicle license plate emblem
- 16 program.))
- 17 **Sec. 6.** RCW 46.16.381 and 1993 c 106 s 1 are each amended to read
- 18 as follows:
- 19 (1) The director shall grant special parking privileges to any
- 20 person who has a disability that limits or impairs the ability to walk
- 21 and meets one of the following criteria, as determined by a licensed
- 22 physician:
- (a) Cannot walk two hundred feet without stopping to rest;
- 24 (b) Is severely limited in ability to walk due to arthritic,
- 25 neurological, or orthopedic condition;
- 26 (c) Is so severely disabled, that the person cannot walk without
- 27 the use of or assistance from a brace, cane, another person, prosthetic
- 28 device, wheelchair, or other assistive device;
- 29 (d) Uses portable oxygen;
- 30 (e) Is restricted by lung disease to such an extent that forced
- 31 expiratory respiratory volume, when measured by spirometry is less than
- 32 one liter per second or the arterial oxygen tension is less than sixty
- 33 mm/hg on room air at rest;
- 34 (f) Impairment by cardiovascular disease or cardiac condition to
- 35 the extent that the person's functional limitations are classified as
- 36 class III or IV under standards accepted by the American Heart
- 37 Association; or

- 1 (g) Has a disability resulting from an acute sensitivity to 2 automobile emissions which limits or impairs the ability to walk. The 3 personal physician of the applicant shall document that the disability 4 is comparable in severity to the others listed in this subsection.
- 5 (2) Persons who qualify for special parking privileges are entitled to receive from the department of licensing a removable windshield 6 7 placard bearing the international symbol of access. The department 8 shall design the placard to be displayed when the vehicle is parked by 9 suspending it from the rearview mirror, or in the absence of a rearview 10 mirror the card may be displayed on the dashboard of any vehicle used to transport the disabled person. Instead of regular motor vehicle 11 license plates, disabled persons are entitled to receive special 12 13 license plates bearing the international symbol of access for one vehicle registered in the disabled person's name. Disabled persons who 14 15 are not issued the special license plates are entitled to receive a 16 second special placard. Persons who have been issued the parking 17 privileges and who are using a vehicle or are riding in a vehicle displaying the special license plates or placard may park in places 18 19 reserved for mobility disabled persons. The director shall adopt rules providing for the issuance of special placards and license plates to 20 public transportation authorities, nursing homes licensed under chapter 21 22 18.51 RCW, boarding homes licensed under chapter 18.20 RCW, senior 23 citizen centers, ((and)) private nonprofit agencies as defined in 24 chapter 24.03 RCW, and vehicles registered with the department as 25 <u>cabulances</u> that regularly transport disabled persons who have been 26 determined eligible for special parking privileges provided under this 27 The director may issue special license plates for a vehicle registered in the name of the public transportation authority, nursing 28 home, boarding homes, senior citizen center, ((or)) private nonprofit 29 30 agency, or cabulance service if the vehicle is primarily used to transport persons with disabilities described in this section. Public 31 transportation authorities, nursing homes, boarding homes, 32 citizen centers, ((and)) private nonprofit agencies, and cabulance 33 34 services are responsible for insuring that the special placards and 35 license plates are not used improperly and are responsible for all fines and penalties for improper use. 36
- 37 (3) Whenever the disabled person transfers or assigns his or her 38 interest in the vehicle, the special license plates shall be removed 39 from the motor vehicle. If another vehicle is acquired by the disabled

- person and the vehicle owner qualifies for a special plate, the plate shall be attached to the vehicle, and the director shall be immediately notified of the transfer of the plate. If another vehicle is not acquired by the disabled person, the removed plate shall be immediately surrendered to the director.
- (4) The special license plate shall be renewed in the same manner 6 7 and at the time required for the renewal of regular motor vehicle 8 license plates under this chapter. No special license plate may be 9 issued to a person who is temporarily disabled. A person who has a 10 condition expected to improve within six months may be issued a temporary placard for a period not to exceed six months. The director 11 12 may issue a second temporary placard during that period if requested by 13 the person who is temporarily disabled. If the condition exists after six months a new temporary placard shall be issued upon receipt of a 14 15 new certification from the disabled person's physician. placard of a disabled person shall be renewed, when required by the 16 director, by satisfactory proof of the right to continued use of the 17 18 privileges.
- 19 (5) Additional fees shall not be charged for the issuance of the 20 special placards. No additional fee may be charged for the issuance of 21 the special license plates except the regular motor vehicle 22 registration fee and any other fees and taxes required to be paid upon 23 registration of a motor vehicle.
- 24 (6) Any unauthorized use of the special placard or the special 25 license plate is a misdemeanor.
- 26 (7) It is a traffic infraction, with a monetary penalty of fifty 27 dollars for any person to park a vehicle in a parking place provided on 28 private property without charge or on public property reserved for physically disabled persons without a special license plate or placard. 29 30 If a person is charged with a violation, the person shall not be determined to have committed an infraction if the person produces in 31 court or before the court appearance the special license plate or 32 placard required under this section. A local jurisdiction providing 33 on-street parking places reserved for physically disabled persons may 34 35 impose by ordinance time restrictions on the use of these parking 36 places.
- 37 (8) The portion of a penalty imposed under subsection (7) of this 38 section that is retained by a local jurisdiction under RCW 3.46.120, 3.50.100, 3.62.020, 3.62.040, or 35.20.220 shall be used by that local

- 1 jurisdiction exclusively for law enforcement. The court may also
- 2 impose an additional penalty sufficient to reimburse the local
- 3 jurisdiction for any costs it may have incurred in removal and storage
- 4 of the improperly parked vehicle.
- 5 (9) It is a misdemeanor for any person to willfully obtain a
- 6 special license plate or placard in a manner other than that
- 7 established under this section.
- 8 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 7.** A new section is added to chapter 28B.10 RCW
- 9 to read as follows:
- 10 A collegiate license plate fund is established in the custody of
- 11 the state treasurer for each college or university with a collegiate
- 12 license plate program approved by the department under section 3 of
- 13 this act. All receipts from collegiate license plates authorized under
- 14 RCW 46.16.301 shall be deposited in the appropriate local college or
- 15 university nonappropriated, nonallotted fund. Expenditures from the
- 16 funds may be used only for student scholarships. Only the president of
- 17 the college or university or the president's designee may authorize
- 18 expenditures from the fund.
- 19 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 8.** By January 1, 1996, the department of
- 20 licensing shall report to the legislative transportation committee
- 21 regarding the number of colleges or universities issued a collegiate
- 22 license plate series, and the total number of collegiate plates issued
- 23 for each participating college or university.
- 24 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 9.** RCW 46.16.323 and 1990 c 250 s 7 are each
- 25 repealed.
