- 6 ((Every person who, (1) without lawful excuse shall refuse or
- 7 knowingly fail to make or furnish any statement, report, or information
- 8 lawfully required of him by a public servant, or (2) in any such
- 9 statement or report shall make any knowingly untrue statement to a
- 10 public servant, or (3) shall knowingly hinder, delay, or obstruct any
- 11 public servant in the discharge of his official powers or duties; shall
- 12 be quilty of a misdemeanor.))
- 13 (1) A person is guilty of obstructing a law enforcement officer if
- 14 the person:
- 15 (a) Willfully makes a false or misleading statement to a law
- 16 enforcement officer who has detained the person during the course of a
- 17 <u>lawful investigation or lawful arrest; or</u>
- 18 (b) Willfully hinders, delays, or obstructs any law enforcement
- 19 officer in the discharge of his or her official powers or duties.

- 1 (2) "Law enforcement officer" means any general authority, limited
- 2 <u>authority</u>, or <u>specially commissioned Washington peace officer or</u>
- 3 <u>federal peace officer as those terms are defined in RCW 10.93.020, and</u>
- 4 other public officers who are responsible for enforcement of fire,
- 5 <u>building</u>, zoning, and life and safety codes.
- 6 (3) Obstructing a law enforcement officer is a gross misdemeanor.
