- 18 federal service as a member of the armed military or naval forces of

- (c) The veteran's adjusted gross family income as most recently 1 reported to the internal revenue service does not exceed Washington 2 3 state's median family income as established by the federal bureau of 4 the census. For the purposes of this section, "a veteran of the Persian Gulf combat zone" means a person who during any portion of 5 calendar year 1991, served in active federal service as a member of the 6 armed military or naval forces of the United States in a combat zone as 7 8 designated by the president of the United States by executive order.
